LOCAL LAW 4 OF 2010

A LOCAL LAW PROVIDING FOR A FOUR-YEAR TERM FOR THE ELECTIVE
OFFICE OF THE TOWN CLERK OF THE TOWN OF BELLMONT.

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Bellmont as follows:

1. The term of office of the elective position of Town Clerk shall be four years. Such four-year term shall commence on the first day of January following the first biennial town election after the effective date of this Local Law.
2. At the biennial town election next following the effective date of this Local Law , and every four years thereafter, the Town Clerk shall be elected for a term of four years.
3. This Local Law shall supersede in its application to the Town of Bellmont section 24 of the Town Law of New York State with respects to the terms of office of the elective Town Clerk.
4. This Local Law shall be submitted for approval to the electors of the Town Bellmont at the next general election to be held in November, 2011.
5. Any other local law, ordinance or resolution inconsistent herewith is hereby repealed.
6. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State and after approval by a majority of the electors voting thereon in accordance with the requirements of section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Such local law was subject to permissive referendum and no valid petition requesting such referendum was filed as of _____ 20 _____, in accordance with the applicable provisions of law.

* Elective Chief Executive Officer means or includes the chief executive officer of a county elected on a county-wide basis or, if there be none, the chairperson of the county legislative body, the mayor of a city or village, or the supervisor of a town where such officer is vested with the power to approve or veto local laws or ordinances.

5. (City local law concerning Charter revision proposed by petition.)

I hereby certify that the local law annexed hereto, designated as local law No. _____ of 20 _____ of the City of _____ having been submitted to referendum pursuant to the provisions of section (36)(37) of the Municipal Home Rule Law, and having received the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified electors of such city voting thereon at the (special)(general) election held on _____ 20_____, became operative.
