THE 2021 TENTATIVE BELLMONT ANNUAL BUDGET HAS BEEN APPROVED. WE ARE OVER THE TAX CAP OF 1.56%. A PUBLIC HEARING WILL BE REQUIRED TO OVERRIDE THE TAX LEVY LIMIT ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW 3-C. THIS LAW IS ADOPTED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION 5 OF GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW 3-C, WHICH EXPRESSLY AUTHORIZES THE TOWN BORD TO OVERRIDE THE TAX LEVY LIMIT BY ADOPATION OF THE LOCAL LAW APPROVED BY A VOTE OF SIXTY PERCENT (60%) OF THE TOWN BOARD. WE WILL HAVE A LEGAL NOTICE IN THE PAPER INDICATING THAT THERE WILL BE A PUBLIC HEARING ON NOVEMBER 2, 2020 HELD AT THIS TOWN OFFICE AT 7:30PM TO PASS THIS LAW. TOWN BUDGET MAY THEN BE ADOPTED, LAST DAY TO FILE IS 11/5/2020. THERE ARE SOME ADJUSTMENTS TO THE BUDGET THAT WILL REQUIRE BOARD APPROVAL PRIOR TO ADOPTION.
