



Abortion awards are given out in several states. The Pennsylvania governor was an escort and proud to support Planned Parenthood. Are there funding for an abortion mill near his office? He wants your daughter or any women to destroy their baby. Planned Parenthood will donate millions of dollars for his next campaign.

An unborn baby's heart begins to beat 18-21 days after fertilization. Brain waves can be detected as early as 40 days after fertilization. Since 1973, there have been more than 55 million abortions in the United States. Women have cited "social reasons," not mother's health or rape/incest, as their motivation in approximately 93% of all abortions.

A March 2013 poll by The Polling Company found that 53% of Americans oppose legal abortion except in only three or fewer circumstances: when the pregnancy results from rape or incest or when it threatens the life of the mother.
