PARTY PLANNING CHECKLIST



BEFORE THE PARTY	Have a wet weather backup plan (especially if outdoors). Can you move things inside? Need a gazebo or shelter?
	Ask guests to RSVP with dietary requirements or allergies. Avoid last-minute surprises!
	Prep a 'quiet zone' or chill space for kids who might need a break from noise and chaos.
	Plan for early birds and late stragglers. Have simple activities or toys ready for waiting kids.
	Charge your phone or camera fully the night before, and make sure you have storage space!
	Have a gift station or box to keep presents organized and label who gave what.
	Bring bin bags, wet wipes, and paper towels - trust me, you'll be glad you did.
	Label food and drinks clearly if there are allergens.
	Set up a mini first-aid kit – plasters, tissues, antihistamines, just in case.
	Have a playlist ready even if you booked entertainment – for any downtime.
	Think about sun and shade. Balloons pop, kids get tired, and sun cream may be needed!
	Prep a bag of last-minute extras - tape, scissors, extra cups, candles, matches/lighter, string, sticky tack, safety pins.





Take a 'before' photo of the setup, a lovely memory of all your hard work!
Don't forget to eat something yourself!
Introduce your entertainer to the birthday child. It helps calm nerves and build rapport.
Hand out goody bags before the kids leave. Have them by the door or assign a helper.
Take a moment to pause and enjoy it. The magic isn't just for the kids!
Clear a dedicated performance area with good lighting and enough space for all kids to see.
Consider providing a spot for balloon creations to be kept safe. Balloons are fragile!
Remind parents to have cameras ready, especially during the magic show. Magical moments happen fast!
Communicate any special needs or requests in advance.
Write down who gave what before tossing wrapping. This saves guesswork for thank-you cards.
Keep a party notes doc or notebook - what worked, what didn't, and food favorites for next time!
