Learn to Knit (Class Plan)

Welcome. This program is designed to help you learn to knit. We'll explore the essential elements of knitting: casting on, knit stitch, purl stitch, and binding off, as well as stitch combinations, increases/decreases, and blocking. There will be time in each class to practice each skill. If time allows, we can also review your knitting samples.

Shopping List (Available at local yarn shops, large craft stores, online)

- Smooth, light-colored, worsted weight yarn (wool recommended) one (1) skein
- Size 8 US (5.0 mm) knitting needles 7" to 10" (18 to 25 cm) straight needles
- Tapestry needles
- Scissors
- Size 8 (5.0 mm) crochet hook

Class 1: Knitting Basics & Getting Started.

Objective: Introduce students to knitting tools, terminology, and basic techniques.

Introduction (10 minutes)

- Welcome and introductions.
- Brief overview of the class structure and goals.
- Show examples of simple knitting projects to inspire students.

Tools & Materials (15 minutes)

- Explain knitting needles (types, sizes, materials).
- Discuss yarn types, weights, and how to read labels.
- Demonstrate how to match needles to yarn.
- Allow students to handle tools and yarn to get comfortable.

Casting On (30 minutes)

- Teach the long-tail cast-on method (or another beginner-friendly method).
- Practice casting on 10-20 stitches.
- Provide individual guidance to ensure everyone is comfortable

The Knit Stitch (30 minutes)

- Demonstrate the knit stitch slowly.
- Have students practice knitting rows.
- Troubleshoot common beginner mistakes (e.g., dropped stitches, tension issues).

Fixing Mistakes (20 minutes)

- Teach how to fix dropped stitches and unknit (tink).
- Show how to count stitches and rows.
- Practice these skills on their swatches.

Wrap-Up & Homework (15 minutes)

- Assign homework: Practice casting on and knitting rows.
- Encourage students to bring their practice swatches to the next class.
- Open the floor for questions and provide tips for staying motivated.
- Share a handout or quick reference guide for clss

Class 2: Building Skills

Objective: Introduce the purl stitch and basic pattern reading.

Review & Warm-Up (15 minutes)

- Review casting on and the knit stitch.
- Address any questions or challenges from homework.
- Practice knitting a few rows to warm up.

The Purl Stitch (30 minutes)

- Demonstrate the purl stitch.
- Explain how it differs from the knit stitch
- Practice alternating rows of knit and purl stitches.
- Introduce the concept of stockinette stitch (knit one row, purl the next).
- Provide individual guidance to ensure everyone is comfortable.

Combining Stitches: Ribbing & Gartner Stich (30 minutes)

- Teach how to alternate knit and purl stitches within the same row (e.g. K2, P2 for ribbing)
- Practice creating a small swatch with ribbing.
- Introduce garter stitch (knit every row) as a simple texture option)
- Discuss how combining stitches creates different textures and patterns.

Reading Patterns (30 minutes)

- Explain how to read a simple knitting pattern.
- Introduce common abbreviations (e.g., K, P, CO, BO).
- Practice following a basic pattern for a small swatch.
- Discuss the importance of gauge and how to measure it

Wrap-Up & Homework (15 minutes)

- Assign homework: Practice knitting and purling. (creating a small swatch in stockinette stitch).
- Encourage students to bring their swatches to the next class.
- Optional: Suggest they bring a simple project idea (scarf, dishcloth) for the final class
- Open the floor for questions and provide additional tips for troubleshooting
- Optional: Bring a simple project idea (e.g., a scarf or dishcloth) for the next class.

Class 3: Putting It All Together

Objective: Start a simple project and build confidence.

Review & Warm-Up (15 minutes)

- Review the knit and purl stitches.
- Address any questions or challenges from homework.
- Have students knit a few rows to warm up and troubleshoot any lingering issues.
- Practice alternating stitches (e.g., ribbing: K2, P2).

Starting a Project (45 minutes)

- Help students choose a beginner-friendly project (e.g., a garter stitch scarf, dishcloth, or simple hat).
- Guide them through casting on the required number of stitches, reading a pattern (if applicable), starting
 the first few rows.
- Provide individual support to ensure everyone is comfortable with their project
- Discuss how to measure progress and check gauge as they work.

Binding Off & Finishing (30 minutes)

- Demonstrate how to bind off stitches.
- Practice binding off on a small swatch.
- Explain how to weave in ends using a tapestry needle.
- Discuss blocking to shape and set their finished projects.
- Share tips for caring for knitted items (e.g., washing and storing)

Q&A and Troubleshooting (15 minutes)

- Open the floor for questions.
- Provide tips for staying motivated and finding resources (e.g., online tutorials, local knitting groups).
- Offer encouragement and advice for staying motivated.

Wrap-Up & Next Steps (15 minutes)

- Celebrate progress and encourage students to continue knitting.
- Share resources for patterns, yarn shops, and online communities.
- Suggest next steps, like learning to knit in the round or trying new stitch patterns.
