You may remember that for some time the Board has been planning to purchase adjacent land across the alley to the east. where two houses now stand. Inspections, abatements. demolition, etc. are on the agenda.

Also, you may remember that a stabbur has been donated to the Ager Association. But the transport of the stabbur is a cost the Association must absorb. More on this soon, we hope. Hello all Ageriens!

All is well, but things are not moving as fast as I want. The asbestos report on 1610 Whipple St. finally arrived the other day. I am presently connecting with the asbestos abatement company.

A major concern is that the final "renter" is still in their apartment. Papers have been served, but the final fly in the ointment was that the renter has complained to the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection that we did not follow due process.

We have responded to the complaint and done all we can do to help the family understand the situation. The Waldemar Ager Association cannot be a landlord. There are insurance issues and possibly other issues with which to contend.

Of the many other issues to address, the Stabbur has to be moved. We thought that was included in the deal, but apparently not. One mover may be able to take it from Osseo to Eau Claire, but for a fee of course. More work to be done. I am trying to convince a mover from Chippewa Falls to help us.

The two dying ash trees by the museum came down finally! A crew of members and friends of the Association cleaned up the area and it looks very tidy!

The city of Eau Claire has given notice of a change in the zoning of adjacent properties. The Senior Center is asking that the zoning be changed from R-4 (Multi-Family Residential District) to CBDP (Central Business District-Planned Development). The Senior Center needs this change to expand its parking area. I think this is a good move. I spoke in favor of the proposal at a recent Planning Commission meeting. There will be two entrances to the parking area on Whipple Street.

The association is very active in the community. Doug's activity schedule is full. We have visits of children and open houses. Then there is the Tusenbeiner and plenty of other things to do. Planning for the Annual Meeting is in full swing as well. We love to hear from you and of your projects.

### Helping the Waldemar Ager Association and Museum Grow!



#### Honoring Ager's Bithday

In recent years, Association members have gathered in March to remember Waldemar Ager's birthday. Often the weather has been unsuitable, leading to a cancellation. This year we postponed the event to May 27. At graveside, Doug Pearson reminded us of some highlights of Ager's life, and Bob Gough offered interesting comments on the social and physical aspects of Lakeview cemetery. Here are excerpts from Gough's remarks.

"Why is Ager buried here? A cemetery named Lakeview is an appropriate resting place for him, since, when Ager's house was at 327 Chestnut, it had a great view of Half-Moon Lake. This lake was surely what Ager had in mind when he referred to "the lake," in *Christ Before Pilate*, and probably elsewhere in his writings. [The site] was also convenient to Ager's church, where his funeral service occurred, and to the hospital he helped raise funds for.

"Ager and seven members of his family are buried with flat markers indicating their interment. . . . At the time of Ager's death there was talk about building a larger memorial monument. This [idea] doesn't seem to have gotten off the ground until [1944, three years after Ager's death]. In July 1944 . . . the Ager memorial committee, under the aegis of the Central Committee of the Norwegian Societies of Eau Claire, initiated fundraising. . . . The memorial was dedicated on November 18, 1945."
