## Plan and Protocols to Reopen the Ager House during the current Covid-19 Pandemic

The Ager House will remain closed to the public through August 2020. Tentatively, we will reopen to the public with our open house scheduled for Saturday, September 12th and thereafter resume a normal open house schedule. The following safety protocols will be adhered to until further notice:

- All volunteers and visitors will be required to wear facemasks when two or more people are present in the house. Signage will be posted around the house announcing this rule.
- Social distancing will be practiced. Ideally, no more than one person or family present in a room at one time. Signage will be posted around the house announcing this rule.
- Volunteers will be required to sanitize all commonly used areas of the house following open hours. This includes, but is not limited to, door handles, light switches, faucets, sinks, and toilets. The Ager Association will provide a supply of disinfecting wipes.
- Classes and other events at the house are cancelled until further notice.

The Association's board of directors will continue to closely monitor this situation. Ideally, we will relax some of these temporary protocols and resume classes, programs, and other events in September as possible and in accordance with best practices.

The program committee is encouraged to explore ways in which the new website and/or social media could be better utilized to engage with our audiences during this time. Additionally, the Association should consider how a self-guided tour could be developed and available ahead of our open house in September.

## How are Scandinavian Countries Handling COVID-19?

**Denmark** (population 5.8 million). On lockdown since March 11. 10,968 cases, 548 deaths ( 5.15.20).

**Finland** (population 5.5 million). State of Emergency on March 16. 6,380 cases, 300 deaths (5.15.20).

**Iceland** (population 364,000). Testing and tracing. Not on lockdown. 1802 cases, 10 deaths (5.15.20).

**Norway** (population 5.4 million). Safety measures, including social distancing since March 12. 8,249 cases, 233 deaths (5.15.20)..

**Sweden** (population 10.1 million). No general lockdown. As of April 29, 30,377 cases, 3,698 deaths (since 5.15.20).

**UK** (population 67.8 million). Established a national lockdown in April. 243,695 cases, 34,636 deaths (5.15.20).

**USA** (population 331 million). No general lockdown. States have mandated emergencies and lockdowns. 1.4 million cases, 80,084 deaths (5.15.20).

**WI** (population 5.9 million). State of Emergency since March 12 11,685 cases, 445 deaths (5.15.20).

Note: We wondered what Waldemar Ager had to say about the Spanish Flu of 1918. We referred our question to Association member Jan Hansen. He searched relevant issues of the online version of *Reform*. He was unable to locate any comments from Ager.
