I come from a great family. I have a mom and dad that love me and their main goal growing up was to take care of me and my siblings.

We were just really poor. Like really poor. My parents couldn't take care of me the way they wanted. They both worked, but they didn't have much education and couldn't find a job that paid well.

We struggled my entire life. Vacations and toys weren't even a possibility and 3 meals a day were never promised.

When I was about to graduate high school and I needed help with community college, one of my teachers told me about YouthHope.

I went to YouthHope and asked them if they could

help me buy my books and they said yes.

I was able to finish my AA because of their help.

After I earned my AA, I found myself without a place to live. My parents couldn't afford to take me back in and I was homeless.

I went back to YouthHope to see if there was anything they could do for me.

They immediately got me into housing. They knew how urgent it was and didn't

want me staying in my car or being on the streets for a single night.

I went from being homeless to having a room that was all mine.

I now have a good job, still in the same house, and I've never felt so safe or taken care of before.
