I'm a foster kid. I grew up in different homes, never staying in one spot for very long.

As I got older, I had to live in group homes. It was awful. I never felt safe, never felt loved, and never felt like I belonged.

At 18, I aged out of the foster care system and was left to fend for myself.

I met Bob through a friend as I was exiting foster care. He took me in and became like a dad to me. He let me live with him and use his car and helped me get a job.

It all seemed to be working out until one day, when I started to feel like I wasn't welcome. He started yelling at me, telling me that I'm in the house too much, and eventually told me to get out.

I had no where to go and nowhere to sleep. I found YouthHope when I was looking for resources in the area.

I went to YouthHope the next day and they offered me food, clothing, and helped me with housing. They told me that I could move into their housing and it would provide me with an opportunity to become self-sufficient while not having to worry about where I was going to sleep.

I've been a part the housing program for a while now and I am so proud of how far I've come. I have a job I love, I'm going to school, and for the first time, I feel like I have a family who loves and cares for me and is rooting for me to be successful.

My story isn't over. It's just beginning.
