Managers are able to interact with youth, develop trusting relationships, determine individual needs, and make appropriate referrals to services provided by YouthHope or collaborative community partners. Case Managers are able to identify and facilitate access to resources that youth can provide clean, nice may not be aware of or are too intimidated to contact on their own.

Because of the extremely generous people in our community, we have a full clothing closet that our youth can take clothes for free. Fitting in and not being labeled as "homeless" or "dirty" is very important to our youth and we are so thankful that we clothing for our youth while they are becoming selfsufficient.

I Can Finally Breathe

I grew up in the foster care system. I never stayed in one house for that long. Nothing ever really felt like "home". No one really treated me like their child. I was more of an annoyance than anything else.

When I was 17, I ran away from my last foster house. I couldn't take it any more. I had lived way too many years being yelled at, not being loved and feeling trapped. I knew that living on the streets would be better than suffering at any foster home.

The first couple of nights on the street were the hardest. I didn't know anyone and I didn't know how the street life worked.

After a few days, I found a group of people that took me in. They helped me figure out this street life and taught me how to survive.

They also told me about Youth-Hope and how the people there can help. I decided to go to YouthHope the next day and check it out. Everyone was super nice and welcoming. When I first walked in, I got a hug and was offered free food, clothes, medical care, and anything else that I might need. They didn't even know my story or the things that I've done and they still treated me like a friend.

YouthHope became a refuge for me. I came every day they were open and started getting pieces of my life together. I got my I.D., my resume, my food handlers certificate, and some job training. Right when I thought I was about to get off the streets, something would pull me under. My friends, drugs, or alcohol. Heidi told me that I needed to get away from the distractions. So when I got the opportunity to move across the country with extended family, I took the chance. I was so scared.

Its been six months and I've never been better. I still struggle, but I'm clean from drugs and alcohol, I have a job, and I almost have enough saved for an apartment.
