Bell's Story From A Walk in Their Shoes 2020

There was never enough money in my house. Never enough food. Never a safe place. In between staying with people, we slept in hotels, and in our car. Ya, all 8 of us in a little old beat up car. In the summer it was too hot for us to sleep so close together so we would sleep outside, on the ground, on the hood, I didn't like the bugs crawling on me so my favorite spot was in the trunk of the car. I would leave the trunk open a little and put all of our clothes on top so it made a pretty soft bed and I could stretch my legs and even though it smelled a little like gasoline, I imagined that was what it might feel like to have my own bed in my very own room. The winter was more difficult. You can't hide from the cold, or the smell, or the constant cramping that came from staying in the same position so you didn't bother anybody else. We

never wanted to argue or fight or do anything that would wake up my dad, no one wanted him to get angry. One day we were at the park and these two people showed up with some snacks and told us about a place where we could go get clothes and a hot meal. That's when we learned about YouthHope.

We shared about our struggles and the staff at YouthHope took immediate action to help us. They helped my

sister get her GED, they helped me get a bus pass and get back into school, and they got us all into safe housing so we didn't have to sleep in such an unsafe place.

My parents are in prison now. I don't want to think about what would of happened if we didn't find YouthHope. We would probably be in a really bad place.

We have reopened our Drop-In Center! We are so excited to see our youth again and be able to help them! We are still serving youth at the local park twice a day as well!
