I'm alone and every year at this time, **I am reminded of how alone I am and it feels like a knife to the heart.**

This is why I'm thankful for Youth-Hope and what they offer.

They understand the pain and are here for us no matter what.

My first year coming to the Youth-Hope Thanksgiving dinner was when I really knew that YouthHope understood. It wasn't a big happy celebration, but rather a place where weary souls could come, fill our stomachs, and cry on their shoulders. I left feeling understood and full of hope.

YouthHope's Christmas party has a different vibe to it. It feels like a family get together. It's the one time of the year that I get a wrapped gift that has my name on it. Even though I know it's a pair of shoes, I get so excited every year to unwrap it. It's a small reminder that although I don't have

any biological family supporting me, I have my YouthHope family and people in this community who will buy me a pair of shoes without even knowing who I am. And that makes me feel pretty lucky!

So although I dread this time of the year, I try to remember the positives. I remember those who are cheering me on.

And I'm telling myself that this time next year I will be in a better place.

Thank you YouthHope for making this time of year better than those past years.
