NOTE: if you have an existing Disney account associated with your email address, including for Walt Disney World, Disneyland, Disney+, and more, you may use the same password across all websites and products. A change to the password for one account will result in a change for all accounts.

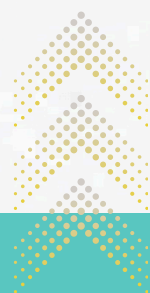


Follow these steps to set up your account:

- Visit www.disneycruise.disney.go.com and click "Sign In or Create Account"
- Enter the requested info, including your email address
- Check the box to agree to the "Terms of Use" and "Privacy Policy" and then click "Create Account." A message will appear to confirm that your account has been created
- You may link your reservation yourself or I am happy to do so - just let me know!

CRUISE PLANNING TIPS

- ✓ For those flying in to the port city: plan to arrive the night before your voyage to ensure an on-time arrival on embarkation day
- ✓ Explore the DCL website to familiarize yourself with the port adventures and onboard activities that will be most interesting to you. Discuss those with me before your booking window opens - I'm happy to provide insight!
- ✓ Budget for extras on your cruise: tips, excursions, dining extras (i.e., adult dining or specialty ice creams), alcohol, transportation to/from port, onboard extras (i.e., Bibbidi Bobbidi Boutique) and retail
- ✓ Join a Facebook group for your cruise itinerary. There are always other travelers asking questions and sharing tips and suggestions from their own experiences
- ✓ Be sure we have chatted about your dining preferences. There are two seatings for the rotational dining each night - an early and a late - as well as adults only dinners and brunches
- ✓ Check now to see if you have the appropriate travel documents for visiting the ports on your itinerary. Double check expiration dates!

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS

PASSPORTS, IDS & WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW



Everyone in your travel party, including babies and children, must present proof of citizenship before boarding the ship.

A passport is your safest and simplest form of documentation because it is valid in any scenario. **It is my strong recommendation that each member of your party has a passport for this cruise.** Passport is best.

While passports are always best, they may not be strictly mandatory for all itineraries. If you do not have a passport and are a US citizen traveling from a US port, are traveling in the Western Hemisphere, and are on a “closed-loop cruise” (one embarking and debarking from the same US port on the same ship), you may be able to use alternative documentation.

For US citizens, including children, the following are accepted for Caribbean and Alaskan cruises:

- Original valid US Passport
- Original valid US Passport Card
- Original valid Trusted Traveler Card (NEXUS, FAST)

or

- Original or copy of state-issued birth certificate AND a physical Government-issued photo ID (digital/mobile state-issued IDs are not acceptable to sail). Puerto Rico birth certificates issued prior to 7/1/10 are not acceptable. Hospital-issued birth certificates are not acceptable
- Original Consular Report of Birth Abroad issued by the Department of State AND a physical Government-issued photo ID

Children 15 years of age and younger are required to present one of the documents listed above, but do not need to present a Government-issued photo ID.

Social Security Cards and Global Entry are not acceptable proof of US citizenship for purposes of traveling outside of the US.
