


A Note from Pastor Seth

More than any other book, the Bible tells us world history and the story of life that we all find ourselves in. When we look at the most important events in the history of the world, the Bible tells us what they are. It tells us the Creation of the universe, the fall of humanity, the global flood, the rise of the nation of Israel, the deliverance of Israel from the Egyptians through God's power. It tells us the rise of the Monarchy in Israel with great kings such as David and Solomon. Then Israel declined as they plunged into sin and God judged them. He used the Assyrians and then the Babylonians to take the Israelites into exile. Not only was Jerusalem destroyed, but so was the Holy Temple. But then God brought Israel back to the land and they were able to rebuild Jerusalem and rebuild the Temple. This is Old Testament history in a nutshell.

But then we get to the New Testament era (the first century) where the most fascinating part of world history happens. The same One, who created this universe and is the author of all of history, enters the story. Think about that. The writer of the story of life becomes a character in the story. Now it is of course true that God was a character in the Old Testament as he worked in every event, but what happened in the first century was different. God became a human (John 1:14). He breathed the same air we breathe. He drank the same water. He ate the same food. What happened is that God, in the second person of the Trinity, took on a new nature.

He became the God-man, maintaining his full deity, while also being fully human. He came to this earth on a mission. This mission is that, "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners" (1 Timothy 1:15).

Two thousand years ago, while the God-man Jesus was in his thirties, the story of human history reached its peak. The great enemy of God, Satan, tried to ruin Jesus, but he failed. When he tempted the first human thousands of years before he succeeded, as Adam fell into sin. But the most evil of all creatures would not succeed with this man. He tried to tempt Jesus to sin but failed. After tempting Jesus. Matthew 4:11 records that Satan walked away in defeat. But Satan was not done just yet. Satan knew that God's plan is that this man before him, Jesus, would reign forever. This was predicted in the Old Testament and he knows the Bible very well. But Satan did not know that Jesus needed to be sacrificed to reconcile humans to God. Satan apparently believed that it was enough for people to believe in God with no permanent, once for all sacrifice necessary. I say this because he was the primary one behind the crucifixion of Jesus. As the apostle records the Devil put it in the heart of Judas to betray Jesus (John 13:2).

Satan thought he could still win and so he thought that by getting Jesus off the scene he would be victorious. He failed in the temptation but he believed he would not fail here. But what Satan did not realize is that this crucifixion he planned through influencing the Jews and Judas would be his undoing.

By delivering Jesus up to be crucified he was committing suicide. When Jesus went to the cross he bore the holy wrath of God and God's wrath was satisfied (Isaiah 53:10). The only way any human can be reconciled to God at any point in history is through the death of Christ. Through this event Satan was defeated. Hebrews 2:14 says that through his death Jesus destroyed, "the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil."

But the authors of Scripture can only describe this victory at the cross because they knew what happened two days later. This month is a celebration of Easter. It is the celebration of a pinnacle event in human history. But if what people all over the world are remembering is not history then we are wasting our time and there is no meaning and hope in life (1 Corinthians 15:17-19). Any other effort at finding meaning and hope is a lost effort. So as you can see there is a ton riding on the historicity of the Bible, and specifically the resurrection. We at Eureka Baptist believe this. We believe that one day Christ will raise us as he was raised (Philippians 3:21). But my prayer is that everyone reading this would believe. The one who understands and believes this has found the meaning of life and will live forever in eternal blessedness with God (John 17:3; Revelation 21-22:5). May we rejoice in that reality this Easter season.

It is always a joy and a blessing to share with you about what God is doing in our lives and ministry here in Albania.

Family update:

We are thankful to God for His protection and provision and care. We have all been very healthy physically, spiritually and emotionally during this time. In February we had snow which is unusual for Tirana. Both our kids and we enjoyed the snow.







Covid 19 Update:

We have very strict restrictions here because of Covid-19. We can't meet with more than 10 people in one room; we are not allowed to go out between 8pm until 6am; we are required to wear masks everywhere we go; the people that come in the church are required to measure fever, etc...

Of course it is not easy to do ministry and serve with all these restrictions, but at the same time there is no reason to stop serving our Lord Jesus and to make His name known among Albanian muslims. We are thankful that God has given us so many opportunities to serve Him.

Even though we have strict restrictions, we are still continuing to meet physically with our church. We just launched a brand new sermon series on the Gospel of Mark called "Crown and the Cross", a great biography of Jesus, who Jesus is and what Jesus did. I'm doing expository preaching going verse by verse, chapter by chapter. After six weeks we are still in chapter two. Every week as I'm preparing for the sermon I'm really growing and enjoying, learning more about Jesus. The church is also experiencing the same thing!

Launching of the youth ministry:

It is our heart and vision to reach young muslim people for Christ. After much prayer and preparation we launched the youth meeting for the first time on January 16th 2021. Anton is leading the youth ministry. I have been discipling Anton for three years, and he is ready to take over leading the youth ministry. It is a great joy and encouragement seeing one of my disciples now discipling others.

Bible Class:

One of the goals we have for this year is to grow strong in the word of God. We started a Bible class for the purpose of learning more from God's word. Pastor Pellumb Ranxha is the pastor that discipled me when I came to Christ 20 years ago, and he is coming now every other Wednesday to teach the Bible to our church.

Pellumb said this to me: 20 years ago I didn't know that you, Toni, would be a church-planter and that you will be a pastor, but I did know I was called to make disciples and that's what I did; and I'm encouraged to see the fruit of the ministry.

We just finished studying bibliology and next week we will start a study on "inductive bible study".

This really is a great opportunity for us to grow more, we are thankful for Pastor Pellumb who is coming to help regarding this.

Thank you so much for partnering with us through prayers and giving from your finances. We are blessed to serve Christ with you in reaching Albanian muslims for Jesus.


