## A Note from Pastor Seth

More than any other book, the Bible tells us world history and the story of life that we all find ourselves in. When we look at the most important events in the history of the world, the Bible tells us what they are. It tells us of the Creation of the universe, the fall of humanity, the global flood, The Tower of Babel and the scattering that followed, the rise of the nation of Israel, the deliverance of Israel from the Egyptians through God's power. It tells us the rise of the Monarchy in Israel with great kings such as David and Solomon. Then Israel declined as they plunged into sin and God judged them. He used the Assyrians and then the Babylonians to take the Israelites into exile. Not only was Jerusalem destroyed, but so was the Holy Temple. But then God brought Israel back to the land and they were able to rebuild Jerusalem and the Temple. This is Old Testament history in a nutshell. But then we get to the New Testament era (the first century) where the most fascinating part of world history happens. The same One who created this universe; the same One who is the author of all of history, enters the story. Think about that. The writer of the story of life becomes a character in the story. This would be like C.S. Lewis entering the story he wrote, The Chronicles of Narnia or J.R.R. Tolkien entering the story he wrote, *The* Lord of the Rings. Now, it is, of course true that God was a character in the Old Testament as he worked in every event, but what happened in the first century was different. God became a human in the person of Jesus (John 1:14). He breathed the same air we breathe. He drank the same water. He ate the same food. What happened is that God, in the second person of the Trinity, took on a new nature. He became the God-man, maintaining his full deity, while also being fully human.

He came to this earth on a mission. The apostle Paul describes this mission in 1 Timothy 1:15, "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners." Two thousand years ago, while the God-man Jesus was in his thirties, the story of human history reached its peak. The great enemy of God, Satan, tried to ruin Jesus, but he failed. When he tempted the first human thousands of years before he succeeded as Adam fell into sin (Genesis 3). But the most evil of all creatures would not succeed with this man. After tempting Jesus, Matthew 4:11 records that Satan walked away in defeat. But Satan was not done just yet. Satan knew that God's plan is that this man before him, Jesus, would reign forever. This was predicted in the Old Testament (Isaiah 9:6-7), and he knows the Bible very well since he has been studying it for millennia. But what Satan didn't know is that Jesus needed to be sacrificed to reconcile humans to God. Satan apparently believed that it was enough for people to believe in God (like Abraham in Genesis 15:6) with no permanent, once for all sacrifice necessary as the book of Hebrews explains was always necessary (Hebrews 9:26).

We can understand this because Satan was the primary one behind the crucifixion of Jesus. As the apostle John records the Devil put it in the heart of Judas to betray Jesus (John 13:2). Satan irrationally thought he could still win and so he thought that by killing Jesus he would be victorious. He failed in the temptation, but he believed he would succeed here. But what Satan didn't realize is that this crucifixion he planned through influencing the Jews and Judas would be his undoing (1 Corinthians 2:8). By delivering Jesus up to be crucified he was committing suicide. The Lord who wills all things (Ephesian 1:11) knew what he was doing all along. As Scripture records, "For truly in this city there were gathered together against your holy servant Jesus, whom you anointed, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, along with the Gentiles and the peoples of Israel, to do whatever your hand and your plan had predestined to take place" (Acts 4:27-28). This was always the Lord's plan, and as the events unfolded, it was a trap that Satan walked right into.

When Jesus went to the cross, he bore the holy wrath of God and God's wrath was satisfied (Isaiah 53:10; Romans 3:24-25). The only way any human can be reconciled to God at any point in history is through the death of Christ. Through this event Satan was humiliated and defeated as his efforts entirely backfired. The author of Hebrews writes that through his death Jesus destroyed, "the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil" (Hebrews 2:14). But the authors of Scripture can only describe this victory at the cross because they knew what happened on the Sunday morning that followed. On that morning Christ was raised gloriously from the dead

(Matthew 28:1-10). This time of year, we celebrate what Jesus accomplished. It is the celebration of the pinnacle of events in human history when God was victorious over Satan in the death and resurrection of Christ. These grand events that we remember every Spring mark the time when sinners who believe in Christ are set free from the bondage that they were held under by sin and Satan (John 8:31-32). Because Christ was raised from the dead two thousand years ago all those who belong to him will be raised along with him (1 Corinthians 15:20-23). We live every day with this certain hope (Philippians 3:21).

While God is victorious and so are his people, Satan is living on borrowed time. He has already been defeated but he refuses to admit defeat. He tries to cause havoc (1 Peter 5:8), but the best he can do is cause havoc as a defeated foe. As a believer reads the end of the Bible we read of his end. As he makes his final push after the onethousand-year reign of Christ, the Lord will finish him off finally and forever. As the apostle John saw in his vision, "And when the thousand years are ended, Satan will be released from his prison and will come out to deceive the nations that are at the four corners of the earth, God and Magog, to gather them for battle; their number is like the sand of the sea. And they marched up over the broad plain of the earth and surrounded the camp of the saints and the beloved city, but fire came down from heaven and consumed them, and the devil who had deceived them was thrown into the lake of fire and sulfur where the beast and false prophet were, and they will be tormented day and night forever and ever" (Revelation 20:7-10). In Satan's irrational pride he always thought he could defeat God, but the all-wise God outsmarted Satan through the redemptive work he planned accomplished by Jesus Christ. Not only is God victorious, but so are we. We truly have "overcome the evil one" (1 John 2:14). During this holy week, may we praise the Father and his Son Jesus in the victory they planned and accomplished in the death and resurrection of Christ.

But why?

Because of His great love for us. He loved us, so He willingly went to the cross to save us.

He died. We lived.

He suffered. We triumphed.

He was held captive. We became more than conquerors.

Because of Jesus, you have been rescued.

And through faith in Him comes no condemnation, no death, no loss of life.

In Christ, you are rescued. Freedom. Forever.

#### Would You Have Welcomed Jesus or Rejected Him? By Billy Graham

Christians around the world celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem (which we usually call "Palm Sunday," because the crowd welcomed Him by spreading palm branches in His path). Those who greeted Jesus were convinced He was the Messiah, or "anointed one," sent by God to establish His Kingdom on earth.

So, why did the crowds turn against Jesus so quickly? One week they welcomed Him, and the next week they demanded He be crucified. No events in human history were more important than Jesus' death and resurrection, and yet many people (even Christians) never take time to study them.

It must have been a dramatic sight as Jesus approached Jerusalem on a donkey (which was a sign of His humility). The Bible says that "the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices ... 'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!'" (Luke 19:37-38). Even those who weren't part of that welcoming crowd listened eagerly to His teaching during the next few days.

But not everyone in Jerusalem welcomed Him; the very next verse says that "the whole city was stirred and asked, 'Who is this?'" But soon many turned against Jesus and demanded His death: "'What shall I do, then, with Jesus who is called Christ?' Pilate asked. They all answered, 'Crucify him!'" (Matthew 27:22).

These weren't necessarily the same people who had welcomed Him—but the reversal is still striking. Were they disappointed because He refused to establish an earthly political kingdom? Probably. But Jesus didn't come to set up a new political system. He came instead to change our hearts and save us from our sins by His death and resurrection. He declared during that last week, "My kingdom is not of this world. If it were, my servants would fight. ... My kingdom is from another place" (John 18:36). This deeply disappointed those who hoped He would throw out the hated Roman occupiers. They may also have disliked His demand that they repent.

Where would you have been on that first Palm Sunday? Among the disciples who welcomed Him—or among the skeptical crowds? It's easy to condemn those who condemned Jesus—but would we have acted any differently? We too are sinners, and we too have rebelled against God.

But the central message of Easter is that God still loves us, and because of Christ we can be forgiven. He came for one reason: "Christ died for sins once for all ... to bring you to God" (1 Peter 3:18). May you welcome Him into your life.

•learn the ways Bible prophecy is under siege and how to respond to false claims biblically


•gain helpful historical insights about the rapture and other prophetic issues
