

A Note from Pastor Seth

We have entered the time of season where the leaves are off and we know what that means - November has arrived. In the North Country November is kind of like April. It is a month where there is less beauty in nature because of the barrenness of the landscape. There are many things we tend not to like about winter (the cold!) but the dazzling snow is always a wonder to see and November usually lacks that for the most part. But even though the scenery of this month is not our favorite, one of the biggest holidays of the year falls in this month. That of course is Thanksgiving. The first Thanksgiving ever celebrated took place between the Native Americans and the pilgrims at Plymouth Rock in the early 17th century. The Pilgrims marked this day as one of thanksgiving to God as he empowered them to cross the Atlantic Ocean and enter the New World in America. The Thanksgiving holiday became official in 1863 when President Abraham Lincoln set it aside as a day of gratitude to God for our many blessings in America. This is the history of this holiday. In the present day, if you ask people what they are most thankful for, they will likely leave out the elephant (God) in the room. People may say their family, their job, health, or hobbies but typically the Giver of these gifts is left out. This thanksgiving, I want to encourage you to approach gratitude in the right manner. This of course is not only for this month, but also for every month out of the year. As Christians, our lives should be full of thanksgiving (1 Thessalonians 5:18), but November is a good time to give special attention to this holy practice. The first area we should thank and praise God is for who he is and what he has done. The Lord is worthy of our praise because of his greatness and goodness. King

greatly to be praised" (Psalm 145:3). Then he wrote in another place, "I give thanks to your name for your steadfast love and your faithfulness" (Psalm 138:2). The Lord is worthy of our praise because he is the greatest being there is. There is none greater than he. We should also give him thanks because we experience goodness on a daily basis.

Every genuine Christian reading this can tell of his great works in your life. You have experienced his goodness toward you firsthand. The greatest work he performed is saving you when he sent his son Jesus to die for your sins (John 3:16). We need to continually thank him for rescuing us from the dreadful position we were once in (Ephesians 2:1-3). The apostle Paul knew the glorious work that God performed in saving us. In gratitude he wrote, "Giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins" (Colossians 1:12-14). We come into this world as enemies of a holy God (Romans 5:10), but His grace shown in Christ is what delivers us from that hopeless state. As Paul writes, "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God" (Ephesians 2:8). The gift of salvation is the greatest gift we will ever receive. We should thank the Lord for rescuing us and bringing us into his eternal happiness (Matthew 25:21).

We should also thank the Lord for his earthly blessings. As we look at God's daily provision for us in the details of our earthly lives we have so much to be

David wrote, "Great is the Lord and thankful for (Ephesians 5:20). In your present life, God cares for you (Matthew 6:25-34). We do not have to fear lack of rain or lack of sun (Matthew 5:45). We should thank him that we can live and eat and go on with our lives. In fact, Scripture tells us, "He himself gives to all mankind life and breath and everything (Acts 17:25). Trevor Rubenstein

Eureka Baptist Church financially supports Trevor Rubenstein.

Trevor Rubenstein was born in Virginia, Minnesota where he was raised in a nominal Conservative Jewish home. His family moved to Littleton, Colorado when he was a boy. He received his Bar Mitzvah at thirteen but later embraced atheism. He struggled with depression and consistent thoughts of suicide which led to drinking and drug abuse. He was eventually expelled from high school. Later, when attending a local community college he unknowingly entered a Bible study put together by a cult. He read the words of Jesus for the first time and became overwhelmed by the presence of the Lord. By the grace of God He never joined the cult but soon after did give his life to Jesus (Yeshua). Immediately after his salvation, the depression was gone and he never returned to the substance abuse. Trevor developed a broken heart for the lost and those he could relate to – the depressed, the addict, those involved in cults, but especially the Jewish people. The Lord changed his focus, and he spent much of the next twenty years ministering to hurting people, studying the Bible, and studying the history and teachings of other religions particularly modern rabbinical Judaism. He has been blessed to be able to study under some of the greatest modern Christian apologists. Trevor has worked and volunteered for many ministries and churches including Samaritan's Purse, The Denver Rescue Mission, and Christian Apologetics Research Ministry. He has spent many years traveling the country, teaching at churches, and sharing the message of a saving faith in the Messiah with anyone who will listen. Trevor was also the director of the oldest evangelical outreach to the Jewish people in America. Currently, Trevor is still active in evangelism and discipleship, leading evangelism groups in Minneapolis. He is also embarking on receiving his M.Div. in Messianic Jewish Studies from The Talbot School of Theology through the Charles L. Feinberg Center.



More Than Half of Americans Wish They Would Read the Bible More

According to a study by the American Bible Society (ABS), more than half of Americans say they wish they would read the Bible more but say they fail to do so for a number of reasons, including a lack of time.

The latest release from the ABS's State of the Bible report shows that 52% of Americans say they wish they would read the Bible more. Meanwhile, 14% say they increased their Bible use in the past year.

"Granted, this is a bit like asking, 'Do you wish you exercised more?'" the report researchers said. "Wishing and doing are two different enterprises. But it's still important to know the desire is there. And whatever we could do to increase excitement about the Bible, explain the language, or show where to start, it might move the needle a bit."

Researchers asked the 52% who want to read the Bible more what is preventing them from taking the plunge. The top four answers were:

- "I never seem to have enough time to use it" (26%).
- "I don't know where to start" (17%).
- "I don't feel that excited about using it" (15%).
- "I find the language difficult to relate to" (15%).

And when asked to complete the sentence "I use the Bible because," 47% of participants chose the option "because it brings me closer to God." The other options, along with the response rate, are as follows:

- "I need wisdom for making life decisions" (20%).
- "I need comfort" (15%).
- "It tells me about the nature of God" (9%).
- "It tells me how to treat others" (4%).
- "I know I'm supposed to" (3%).
- "It is a responsibility for a group Bible study or school" (2%).

The study showed that one-fourth of Americans use the Bible at least weekly. Among that group, 72% say that Christ is their most important relationship in life.

"The path toward the Bible intertwines with a spiritual journey into a deepening relationship with Christ," researchers said. "We remember Jesus telling Bible scholars that the Scriptures they studied actually 'testify about me' (John 5:39 NIV). It's no surprise, then, that Bible use at any level—daily, weekly, or a few times a year—increases as people move forward in their relationship with Jesus."

For years, ABS researchers have asked Americans to imagine their nation without the Bible. "If people of our country were to not read the Bible, do you think our country would be worse off, better off, or about the same?" The results have been rather consistent.

"While some observers assume there's a growing animosity toward the Bible, we don't see that on this question," researchers said. "Only about one in seven (14%) say a Bible-less America would be better. Three times that many (44%) take the opposite view, that America would be worse off without Bible-reading. Nearly that number (41%) say there would be little change.

"It's worth noting that more than a quarter of non-Bible users say the country would be worse off without it. They don't interact with Scripture themselves, even three times a year, but they seem glad that others do."
