


CHANGES TO BOOKING ONLINE



Did you know that chewing is the best stress reliever/outlet for dogs? Chewing is an important part of their well being, needs, enrichment and of course relieves teething pain in puppies.

Winter Care for your Dog

Your dog's feet will be subject to snow, ice, cold and salt. We highly recommend protecting their pads with a product or protective boot. A split or cracked pad can take several weeks to heal so it's best to avoid the risk. You can toughen the skin of the pads using Witch Hazel. To avoid cracking and relieve dryness we recommend a product like *Invisible Boot* be applied before heading out for a walk. The Burts Bees lotion is a great way to moisturize dry feet. For the best protection possible, boots are recommended. If you are worried about the boots coming off, you can secure with mitt clips to their coat.

Winter Care continued...

Dogs sweat through their feet and if a dog's feet were sweating indoors, those moist pads can be quite uncomfortable on icy surfaces. Be aware of salted surfaces and if your dog is lifting it's paws, this is indicative that it's either too cold or too uncomfortable. Ice or snow build up between their toes and pads can be extremely uncomfortable for your dog to walk on. Pay attention if your dog is stopping and licking at their feet or appear to be pulling something from their feet. Often times, your warm fingers can release these ice balls but more will form. Keeping the hair trimmed between their pads and utilizing either boots or product can certainly help avoid discomfort or injuries. Of course some breeds of dogs are bred for cold weather and so breed/ coat type, age, body condition and so on, must all be taken into consideration. Walkees boots are coming to PupTown and the design of these is excellent, especially to stay on.

Ideal body condition

Ask the Experts!

How do I know if I am feeding my dog too much?



If you can't easily feel your dog's ribs, then you are most likely overfeeding. Remember that treats count as calories! Your dog should have a visible waist and the ribs should be easily felt with your fingers. Overweight dogs are most likely to develop joint problems and puppies that become overweight during their developmental stages are likely to develop hip dysplasia so be sure to keep your dog's weight in check. Consider checking their thyroid function if you suspect a metabolic problem. Some breeds are meant to be 'leaner' than others. If your dog is fluffy coated, it is best to take a good look at your dog's body condition when they are wet. Consulting your veterinarian is always a good idea.
