48-Hour Film Festival and Red Carpet Gala

Teams in the categories of Junior High, High School, and Adult will gather on Friday evening, May 12th for the initial meeting and receive assignment parameters to create a short video. They will have 2 days to write, produce, film and edit a 5 - 12 minute video to turn in 48 hours later on Sunday, May 14 at a to-be-named venue. The films will be reviewed and a public showing will occur the next weekend, in the style of a Red Carpet Gala.

There is a nominal fee (\$10 for students, \$25 for adults) to encourage completion of the project, but entrance to the Red Carpet Gala will be included for the team members. The Gala and Film Festival will be held on Saturday, May 20th at 7:00 pm at St. Bernardine Fearon Hall at 815 Elgin Avenue. Additional fine artists and a musician or musical group will also be featured.

Meet the Artist

Daniel Marcus is currently a Forest Park based artist who was born and raised in the north suburbs of Chicago. Passionate for Theater, Music, and Photography, Daniel decided to combine everything he loves and went on to earn a BFA in Film at the University of Colorado – Boulder. During his education, he focused on Experimental film and Interdisciplinary art, studying under professors/artists; Stan Brakhage and Robert Schaller. Shying away from linear narrative storytelling, Daniel prefers to experiment in transcendental filmmaking by manipulating space and time through editing, sound and digital effects.

Early on in his career, Daniel and a few of his friends noticed that many young people in the film business have dreams of being professional artists but quickly become disenfranchised, never having the opportunity to share their artwork with their peers. With a few friends, under the leadership of Mo Wadgy, they started “MoFest.” It was a chance for members of the commercial film community to come together and support the artwork of their colleagues who work professionally as crew members. “It’s was a good reminder of why we got into this business. We are all artists! Set builders, grips, production assistants, and accountants chose this business because of their love for the medium and the spirit of collaboration.” The fest lasted 7 years, growing bigger and more demanding each year. Becoming too popular, especially within the ad community, the fest lost its grass roots charm and they collectively decided to end the fest.

Daniel’s favorite component that was integrated for 4 of those years was the 48hour Film Challenge. Something he would like to see reborn here in Forest Park. “I think this town is full of untapped potential. Everyone in this community has something to contribute. Sometimes, we just need an assignment and a little pressure to help push us to reveal the artists that is inside all of us. By collaborating with our neighbors and peers in a positive way, I hope this challenge will be a catalyst to unlock our potential and amplify the voice that is uniquely Forest Park.”
