From the Mayor

Minister for Local Government visit.

The Hon Rhiannon Pearce, Minister for Local Government SA, paid a short visit to Peterborough on Tuesday. The Minister is new to the portfolio and is visiting all SA councils as time and scheduling permit. After the meeting the Minister did a walk up the Main Street with our MP for Stuart, the Hon Geoff Brock, before departing for Port Pirie and then Coober Pedy on the following day. The Minister spoke with Councillors and the Acting CEO re our current financial position, our budget deliberations, forward planning and rate predictions. The Minister showed a keen understanding of our position, asked many questions and reiterated her support for us and all SA councils as we make our plans and efforts to balance budgets and provide services for residents and ratepayers.

Local Government Elections

After weeks of speculation, the SA Government recently voted to delay the planned 2026 Council Elections to April 2027. This has now 'thrown the cat amongst the pigeons' in some sectors as the Local Government Association and LG sector as a whole scramble to put the deferral into place - practically and legally!

As councillors we are legally bound to finish our terms later this year. Special provisions now mean that we are legally bound as councillors until next year. All the rules, Acts and regulations we sit under will stay in place until April 2027. Some councillors in SA will retire at the election and had made plans to go on Australian tours or even overseas, some are actually moving homes - to other areas or interstate! The posters are printed, the advertisements were coming out and extensive planning was taking place all over the State.

We have had meetings, information re the way forward and no doubt there will be more to come.

The new election advertising and crucial dates and timelines will be available online or in newspapers and on posters as they become evident.

Handover Season

Our local Rotary and Lions clubs are holding their annual Handover or Rollover meetings (as it is for the Rotary Club this year).

Both clubs deserve our praise and thanks for all that they do for us as a community on an ongoing basis.

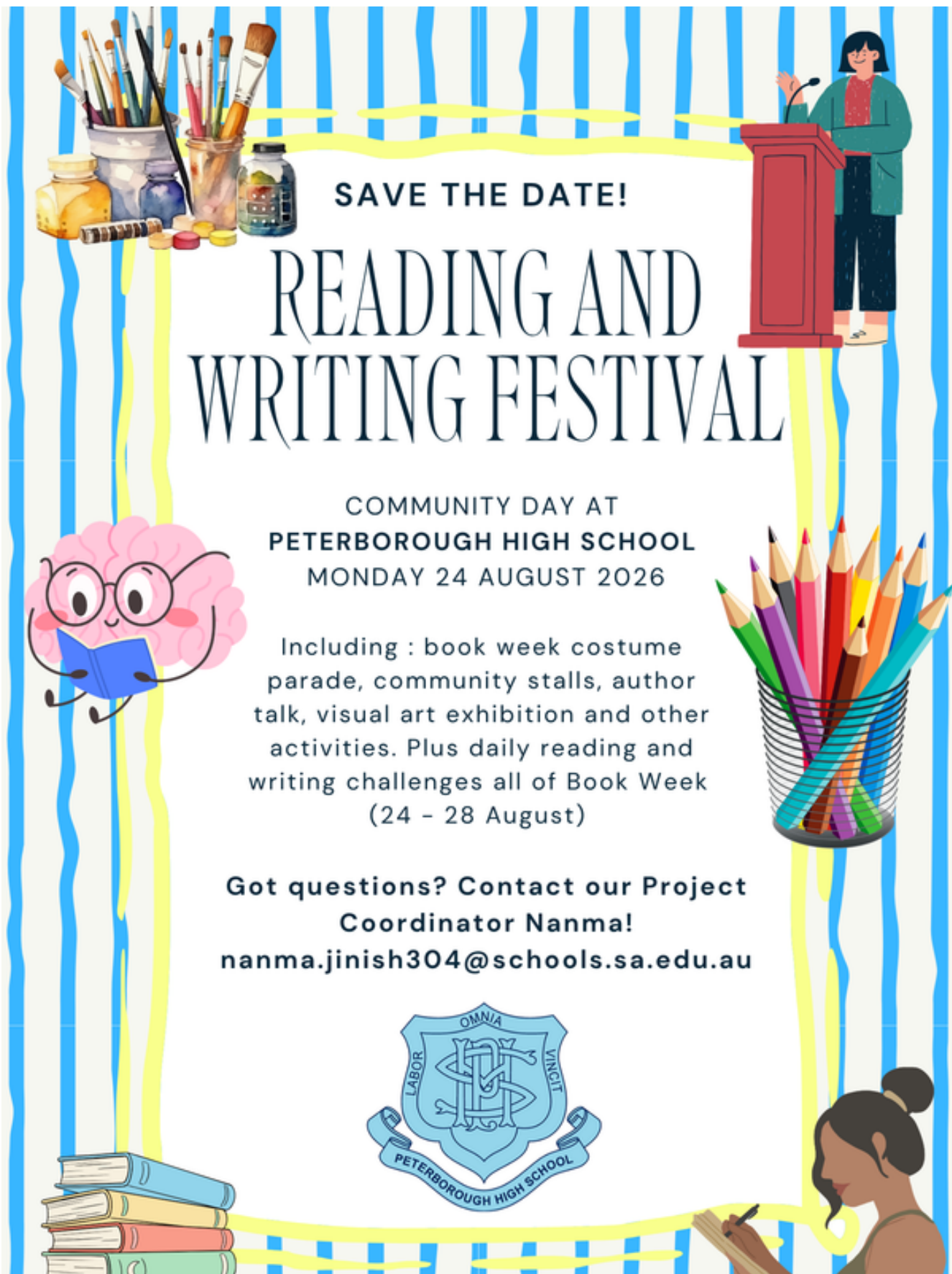

COMMUNITY RADIO

Things are changing here at 5pbs, our local radio station!

Over the last few weeks, we have been quietly working away, cleaning up at our first studio at 290 Main St and moving to new premises further up, at 149 Main St. We now have a bigger studio with an extra editing studio in progress. It is a huge undertaking, and work has not yet finished, but when completed we will have two brand new studios plus space for meetings and displays/storage.

Once completed we will have an open day so you can have a look.

It's wonderful progress for us, we started in 2022 with a Community Radio temporary broadcasting licence for Peterborough, Yongala, Terowie, Oodla Wirra and surrounds, and we have been licensed each year since then. We have grown our programs and number of presenters over that time and still have plenty of room to expand. We have also brought home four awards in excellence from the SA Community Broadcasters Bilby Awards, including two Radio Program of the Year awards, for the History Hour and Circle of Songs. Amazing for a very small, very new station.

So, who are we? We are an Incorporated Association, run by members. We keep our costs low; no paid employees and our transmission site is totally off grid which is a great saver of power costs for us. We tell stories about our past and the people who have built our communities over the decades. We are committed to playing Australian music and music from South Australian artists as well as a whole range of music from the 40s to now.

We support our community by broadcasting information about community groups and events for free.

Of course it's not just playing music, there is a whole range of things members can do, including broadcast tech, editing, producing, archiving music and general admin and other jobs that help keep the station clean and tidy. Anyone can get involved, as a community station we encourage members of our community to contribute to the station in any way they can.

GOLF SEASON

2026 Triangular Series Newsletter



In early June, both Peterborough and Orroroo golfers joined Jamestown members in the first round of the 2026 Jim Davis Memorial Triangular Series with a total of 39 players participating. Since the event's inception in 1999, the purpose of which was to engender closer ties and more regular interaction between the three clubs, it had been held separate from Club Open days until 2021, when the dreaded COVID-19 forced most clubs' programs to be drastically curtailed. The suggestion to hold the event in conjunction with club Open Days to boost numbers persisted for the next 5 years, and this year, the return to the original format has raised very positive comments in terms of participation and catering arrangements and allowing rounds to be rotated each year, thus giving each club the opportunity to host the Final of the Series every third year.

So, Saturday 27th June saw the second round of the event hosted by the Orroroo Golf Club. A great field of 52 players, 17 Peterborough, 19 Jamestown and 16 Orroroo, players enjoyed the great course condition, with many very positive comments on the state of their putting surfaces.

Luckily there was no rain to dampen the spirits despite the freezing conditions, and all players were glad to get into the warm and welcoming clubhouse after finishing their rounds. Everyone enjoyed the usual camaraderie and hospitality offered by Orroroo, with particular thanks to the women caterers and their helpers for their usual fantastic spread.

A very 'Happy Birthday' song marked Captain Snowy White's special day.

The best score for Peterborough was by Greg Budden with 35 points on a countback from Zach Fielding, to win our club's Nutrien Harcourt/Oakley trophy supplied courtesy of Jeff and Gerda. Best for Jamestown was David Hunt on a countback from Tim Kennedy both with 37 points, while for Orroroo Todd Baker had a run-away score of 41 points.

This event is open to both men and women, and it was pleasing to see five of our women players and three from Orroroo as part of our teams. The best female for Peterborough was Lydiah Borowicki with 34 points and Nikki Reid for Orroroo with 32 points.

Saturday, 27 June saw Orroroo take advantage of the home ground to average 30 points, from Peterborough 29.94 and Jamestown 27.79 points. The over-all average result after the first two of three 2026 rounds see Peterborough leading with 27.97 from Orroroo on 27.50 and Jamestown 27.05 points.

The Final 2026 Round will be played at Peterborough on July 11th. Hopefully our mowing volunteers will be able keep ahead of the rapidly growing grasses to present the course in its' usual challenging condition.

CELEBRATING PETERBOROUGH'S CENTENARY BUILDINGS

The Peterborough High School is among the buildings turning 100 this year. The foundation stone was laid on the 17th of September in 1926. **The following extracts have been taken from Peterborough Times Newspaper, September 24th. 1926.**

“THE PREMIER LAYS FOUNDATION STONE The Premier (Hon. Lionel Hill) accompanied the Members for the District (Messrs. M. O’Halloran, S. McHugh and R.J. Hawke), the Hon.P. Blesing, M.L.C., Mr. Adey (Acting Director of Education) and Mr. Allen (Inspector of School Buildings) visited Peterborough Friday last for the purpose of laying the foundation stone of the new High School Building”

“CIVIC RECEPTION On arrival by the afternoon train the Premier and visitors were met at the station by the Mayor, Councillors and High School Committee.” “In laying the foundation stone of the High School, he hoped that the building would not only add to the beauty of the town, would also assist materially in the education of the future generations”

Dr Schaffer, Chairman of School Council presented Mr. Hill with a silver trowel “ the trowel bore the following inscription “Presented to The Hon Lionel T. Hill, M.P., Premier, Treasurer, and Minister of Education on the occasion of laying the foundation stone of the High School at Peterborough, 17th.September 1926”

(we wonder where that silver trowel is now- it would be wonderful to have it return to Peterborough - being a significant item to commemorate 100 years of the history of the High School)

"Next term we have decided to give all our children (600 of them) a Party and Tea making full use of your kind Food Parcels. We will be granted a half holiday for that purpose". From T. H. Jones Head Teacher, Llanbradach Boys School). Miss L. Roberts, Head Teacher of the Girls School sent a similar letter.

1950 (Feb.) Victor Knott and William Seater win both S.A. School of Music

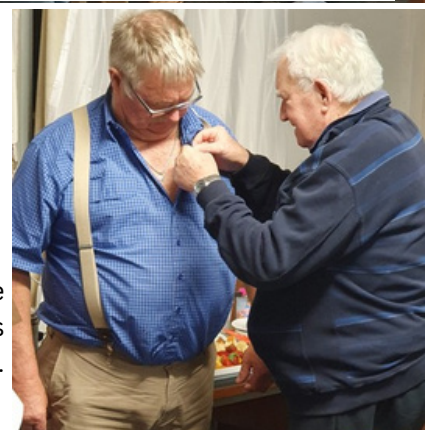

GARDEN

Do you have an abundance of green capsicums in the garden? Then why not give this recipe a try? A tasty and simple chutney. This recipe makes about 2 small jars.

Green Capsicum Chutney



Ingredients

3 seeded green capsicums
1 large onion
3 tomatoes
1 cup cider vinegar
1 cup white wine vinegar
1 ½ cups white sugar
1 tbl mustard seeds
1 tsp salt
1 tsp turmeric
White pepper to taste
1 tbl pl flour
1 tbl corn flour



METHOD

Boil a pot of water, add the tomatoes, and leave for 60 sec. Remove and place in a bowl of cold water; skins should slide off easily.

Dice capsicums (small), onions, and tomatoes.

Into a heavy base pot add vinegars mustard seeds and sugar. Stir over high heat until sugar has dissolved, then add diced vegetables and continue to stir on high heat until vegetables are soft, about 20-25min.

Mix the 2 flours with a little water and make a 'slurry', stir into vegetables. Reduce heat and stir well for 2-3 mins until mixture thickens.

Add salt and pepper and stir well.

Place in sterilized jars, seal and refrigerate - lasts 3-4 weeks.

Serve with cheese and crackers. Also great on cold meats.
