When totally completed you will find - the Council Offices, the Visitor Information Centre, The Rural Transaction Centre and Steamtown Heritage Rail Centre.

At the moment it is just the Council Offices. We will advise when the other services are ready to recommence business.

All the Council Staff have worked diligently shifting, reconnecting and repurposing desks, shelving, cupboards, computers etc to get ready for business to open Monday 2nd March.

The Town Hall will still be used for community events and some office work. My Mayoral Office will still be open as always on Monday mornings in the Town Hall until further notice. Anyone wanting to see me for council business or as a Justice of the Peace is welcome as always. I am available from 10am unless council duties say otherwise.

New Chief Executive Officer

We have a new Acting Chief Executive Officer commencing on 23rd March. Henry Inat will join us and lead the team. Up until then Lisa Stares Manager Corporate Services and Finance, is Acting in the role to keep the wheels turning, supervise the move to Steamtown and take on the CEO duties until Henry arrives. Henry has a long history of working in Local Government and has worked in many Acting roles over the years. He is well known in city councils and in particular in the country as CEO of Gawler, Acting CEO Cleve, Orroroo Carrieton, Northern Areas and currently at Berri Barmera.

I have appreciated the suggestions and support shown by many people and the honest conversations that have been held and still need to be held. Information is the key word - so if you need it - talk to your councillors or to myself. We are available!

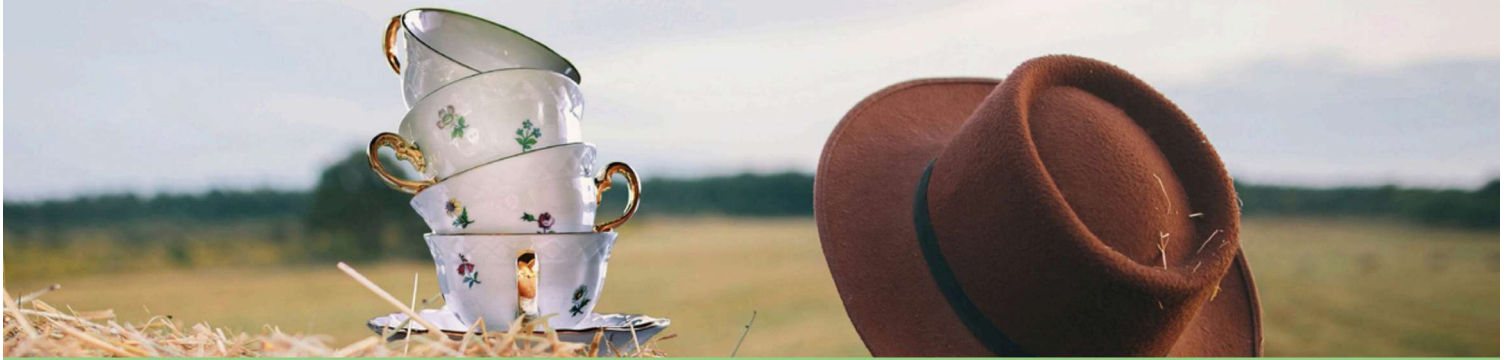

We offer free and confidential mental health support for people living in drought-affected regions.

You don't need to be in crisis to reach out. We can support you with things like managing stress, finding a way forward when you feel stuck or simply having someone to talk to. Whether you're looking for a listening ear or practical support, we're here for you and your family.

- Access drought related financial counselling and other supports
- Get involved in local community or recreational activities
- Explore options for education, training, employment or volunteer work

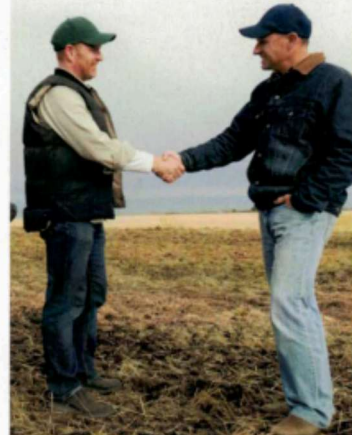

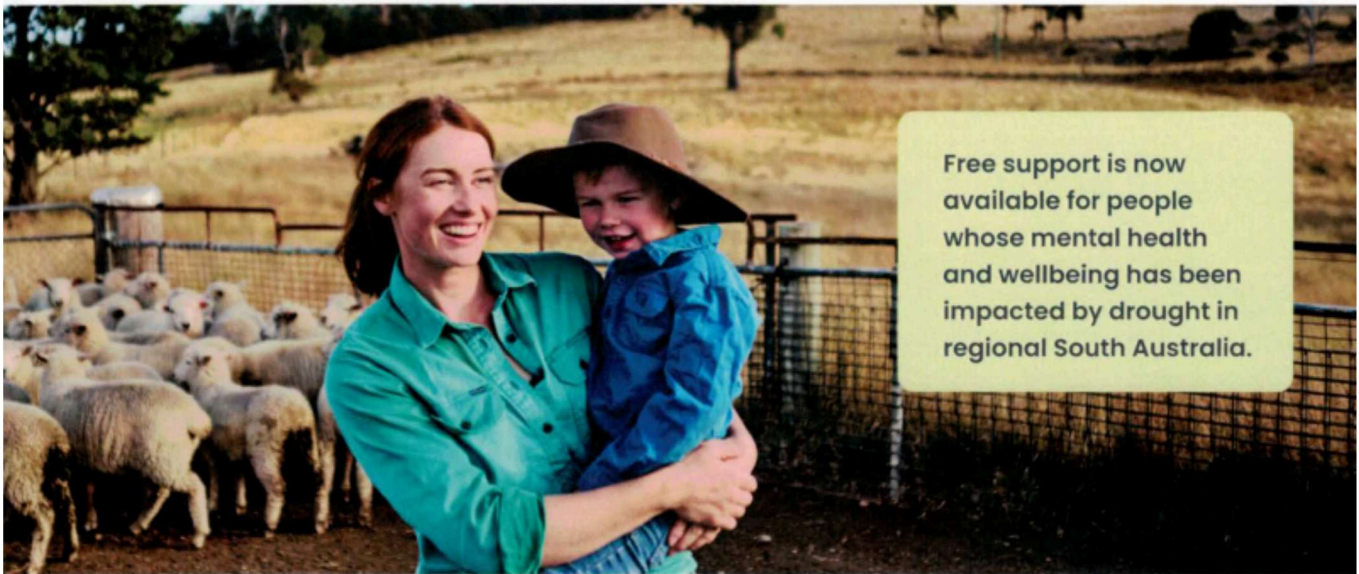

Free support is now available for people whose mental health and wellbeing has been impacted by drought in regional South Australia.

The financial stress, loss of livestock and impact on employment, business and family that drought brings can affect people's mental health and wellbeing. Distress, grief, anger, depression, poor sleep, concentration and appetite are all common impacts.

Drought Mental Health Support provides individual counselling, and support for families and carers. We help you build a recovery plan to address the problems affecting you. We also connect you with organisations that can help you solve other issues.

You can receive one-on-one or group support over the phone or via telehealth. We also do outreach – we can come to your home or meet you somewhere else in your community.

What's Cooking from the Garden

Pumpkin season at PCG is almost upon us.
For a variation on Soup or roast why not try...

Pumpkin & lentils with Yoghurt dressing

Serve with a roast or as 'stand alone' meal.



Peel and cut pumpkin into 3cm cubes .

Cut one red onion into 8 wedges.

Add 4 tablespoons of good olive oil to a large bowl -season with salt and pepper and 1 teaspoon of cumin.

Add pumpkin and onion and coat well using your hands.

Heat oven to 200°C line a baking tray with bake off or similar paper. Bake, for approximately 30 minutes turning once till pumpkin takes colour but remains firm but cooked through.

Drain and thoroughly rinse one can of brown lentils. Set aside.

Dressing: 4 tablespoons of Greek yoghurt

One clove of crushed garlic

1 Tablespoon of honey

1 tablespoon of lemon juice

Splash of olive oil

Season with salt and pepper and mix well

Add lentils to oven tray and allow to warm for a few minutes.

Place the pumpkin onions and lentils onto a serving dish. Drizzle yoghurt dressing over the top garnish with parsley or coriander.



Optional:

Add steamed broccoli or green beans

or

Toasted pine nuts - to add some crunch.
