Northland Area Family Service Center is an independent non-profit agency physically located in Remer, Minnesota serving residents living in the entire Northland School District. Begun by a group of concerned citizens whose goal was to support families in our area by making them stronger, the Family Center has continued to serve area residents through the collaborative efforts of public and private agencies, community members and Northland Community Schools. The Family Center continues to reach out to the community by developing programs that build on the strengths of all participants.





We would like to take this opportunity to thank those who have partnered with us on our work during 2021. The board of Directors continue to be instrumental in leading our organization during this past year, with continued virtual monthly meetings and leadership. We appreciate the gifts of money from donors in helping us provide education, mentoring and support services that build strong individuals and families in the Northland Community.

We would also like to thank Cass County MN for the funding we received from the ARPA Grant (American Rescue Plan Act). Due to the funding we received from this grant, we were able to replace one of the two furnaces located at the family center, which was over 20 years old.

#### **Resource and Referral**

- 91 clients were referred to outside sources (BiCAP, Food Shelf, HHVS (and other services)
- 8 clients accessed Family Center computer for unemployment services, job searches and forms that we have available.
- 18 clients received assistance from Family Center staff to complete application forms for Bi-CAP & Cass County Health Human & Veterans Services.
- 32 clients received assistance regarding MNSure, for applications or had questions.
- 60 persons faxed paper
- 57 people were provided with other "in-house" assistance
- 82 people accessed copies
- We have noticed that due to COVID-19, our "walk-in" traffic to the Family Center is down from previous years. Clients were able to perform the majority of services from on-line applications. We continued to receive phone calls from clients requesting assistance for other cases.

### MN Legal Kiosk Project (computer use)

 The Family Center has obtained 2 Legal kiosks computers, which provide access to legal aid services to individuals without access to wifi or technology. These Legal Kiosks offer the public the ability to apply for civil legal aid services, access legal resources, and, in some cases, attend online meetings and remote court hearings in privacy.

Unfortunately, at this time there has not been any public use of these computers.




### **Program: Family Center Home Visiting**

**Program Goals:** Build and sustain community partnerships to systematically engage overburdened families in home visiting services prenatally or at birth, cultivate and strengthen nurturing parent-child relationships, promote healthy childhood development and growth, and enhance family functioning by reducing risk and building protective factors.

- The Northland site completed 157 visits during 2021 with 8 families.
- The program is guided by an Advisory Board, which meets quarterly.
- Northland Family Center and Pine River-Backus each have a Family Support Specialist and work as a team with two Family Center Directors to provide this program.
- Retention rates are very high for the families currently involved.

#### Parent Child+, is a program of Northland Area Family Service Center and Jewish Family and Children's Service of Minneapolis. Our service area covers the Northland and Pine River/Backus school districts.

ParentChild+ is a free home-visiting program that works to strengthen families and empower parents by providing them with the skills and resources they need to prepare their children for school success. The program is built around an intensive two-year home-visiting model that builds school readiness, child development and parenting skills. ParentChild+ helps the whole family address challenges and prepare for the future.

- · Participating families receive free educational books and toys
- · Families begin the program when their child is 18 months to 2.5 years old
- · Trained early learning specialists work with families in their homes two times a week for two years

Our specialists model engaging and educational activities for parents and children together, and then support parents as they take on the role of their children's first teachers. Children who participated the ParentChild+ are 50% more likely to be ready for kindergarten and graduated high school at a rate of 30% higher than their socio-economic peers.

Some challenges occurred with COVID. On a biweekly schedule, visits continued during the pandemic virtually via zoom, YouTube, facetime, phone and in person. We did comply with CDC guidelines. For all types of visits, educational materials were provided to families.

#### In 2021, 613 visits were completed with 4 children graduating from the 2<sup>nd</sup> year program. Program runs September to the end of May. This is a 2-year program.

Due to COVID, unfortunately this wonderful event was not offered.


### **Toys For Kids**


