



NCFE CACHE Level 3 Diploma in Supporting Teaching and Learning

This qualification is part of the new suite of Supporting Teaching and Learning qualifications and is aimed at learners working in roles that offer specialist support for pupils' learning in primary, secondary or special schools, as well as colleges.

What will be gained?

This qualification provides learners with an in-depth understanding of the knowledge and skills needed when working directly with children and young people in school and college environments. It covers all aspects of specialist support including planning, delivering and reviewing assessment strategies to support learning alongside the teacher; bilingual support; special needs support; and personal development and reflective practice. As learners need to show competence in both skills and knowledge, they will need to be working or be on a practical placement during the taught programme of study in a learning environment (school or college).

How is the course assessed?

The course is assessed using a range of methods, including observation, and is usually completed within 12-18 months. A portfolio of evidence is gathered to demonstrate competencies and knowledge. You will be allocated an assessor who will support you through your learning journey. It can be undertaken as part of a group.

- 13: Understand How to Support Bilingual Learners**
- 14: Understand How to Support Learning of Children and Young People with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities**
- 15: Support Children and Young People during Transitions**
- 16: Support the Role of Play, Leisure and Extra-Curricular Activities for Children and Young People**

Who can apply?

The cost of the course is £650 (payment plans available) and is for people who are aged 19 years or over.

Progression routes

Learners achieving the Level 3 Diploma can progress onto the Level 4 Certificate for the Advanced Practitioner in Schools and Colleges.

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
