



Level 5 Diploma in Leadership for Health and Social Care and Children and Young People's Services (England) (Adults' Residential Management)

The Residential Services pathway is aimed at those in similar job roles as those taking the Management pathways but the focus is on management and care in residential settings.

What knowledge will be gained?

This qualification provides the skills and knowledge needed to manage practice and lead others in adult health and social care provision or in children and young people's services. The qualification covers a wide range of topics including:

- Safeguarding and protection
- Developing and carrying out policy
- Managing care services, change programmes and recruitment
- Promoting and developing best practice
- Supporting development and partnership working
- Care management
- Quality systems and improvement

How is the course assessed?

The course is assessed using a range of methods, including observation, and is usually completed within 18-24 months. A portfolio of evidence is gathered to demonstrate competencies and knowledge. You will be allocated an assessor who will support you through your learning journey.

What will be studied?

The course consists of mandatory and optional units. The mandatory units are:

- Unit 1: Use and develop systems that promote communication Skills**
- Unit 2: Promote professional development**
- Unit 3: Champion equality, diversity and inclusion**
- Unit 4: Develop health and safety and risk management policies, procedures and practices in health and social care or children and young people's settings**
- Unit 5: Work in partnership in health and social care or children and young people's settings**
- Unit 6: Undertake a research project within services for health and social care or children and young people**
- Unit 7: Manage health and social care practice to ensure positive outcomes for individuals**
- Unit 8: Safeguarding and protection of vulnerable adults**
- Unit 9: Lead and manage group living for adults Skills**
- Unit 10: Understand safeguarding of children and young people**
- Unit 11: Lead person-centred practice**
- Unit 12: Lead and manage a team within a health and social care or children and young people's setting**
- Unit 13: Develop professional supervision practice in health and social care or children and young people's work settings**

Who can apply?

The cost of the course is £950 per learner; payment plans are available where needed. Learners should be at least 19 years old and should be working in a management role. Learners must achieve a total of 90 credits for the Diploma.

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
