

Siena & San Gimigano - Private tour with transfer



A great tour will take you to discover Siena with its extraordinary historical and artistic heritage and its unique landscapes. Your dedicated guide will lead you to Piazza del Campo, a large shell shaped square, where many medieval and perfectly preserved buildings stand: the Public Palace with its 14th- century bell tower known as the Mangia Tower, which is one of the tallest ancient towers in Italy (88 meters) and the Cappella di Piazza (1352), built to thank the Virgin by those people who had survived the Black Death. In the middle of the square you will see the Gaia Fountain, the first public fountain, which is a mixture of Gothic tradition and Renaissance innovations. Twice annually (July 2nd and August 16th) in Piazza del Campo it is held the Corsa del Palio, the famous horse races of medieval origin in which the various contrade" face. Then you will visit the Romanesque-Gothic Cathedral, whose interiors house some Pinturicchio's frescoes and Michelangelo's statues, and the magnificent Baptistery (16th century) with its hexagonal baptismal font made from marble, bronze and enamel: this is a main example of the early 15th- century Renaissance sculpture created by the cooperation of the most well-known artists of that time (one of them was Donatello). Than you will visit San Gimignano, a small Tuscan town with a perfectly preserved center dated back to the Middle Ages, except for some 19th and 20th- century renovations. The village stands on a high hill in Val d'Elsa, surrounded by almost two kilometers long walls with five Entrance Gates. Walking through alleys and little streets where the time seems to have stopped, you will admire the Church of Collegiata (the Cathedral), a 12th- century church with a nave and two side aisles and totally frescoed walls, including valuable works by Benozzo Gozzoli; the Chapel of Santa Fina, inside the Collegiata, a real Renaissance jewel, which is famous for its fresco cycle by Ghirlandaio; Piazza della Cisterna, with a monumental travertine well in the middle of the square; the Cathedral Square, with the Palazzo Comunale, the Loggia del Comune and the 54 meters high Torre Grossa, which is the tallest one in the town. Notice that San Gimignano had over seventy towers in the Middle Ages, while only thirteen are left nowadays. Local typical products are the saffron and the Vernaccia wine, which has been appreciated since Dante's time.

Stand below the **arena floor** as you look up at the world's most famous amphitheater surrounding you. Envision the events that took place on the arena floor, where gladiators once fought to the death in pursuit of freedom and glory. Then descend with your group of like-minded adventurers into the **Colosseum Underground** to discover the secrets and mechanisms below the stage floor.

Your guide will meet you in **Largo di Torre Argentina** where you will embark on a journey through the history of Rome. Start at the Pompey's Theatre in the Largo di Torre Argentina

Often overlooked by tourists, this temple complex in the middle of Rome's center was the site of one of history's most infamous events. For it was among one of the rooms attached to the **Theater of Pompey** that **Julius Caesar**, the Roman Republic's most notorious dictator, was **assassinated** on the **Ides of March**, 44 BC.

Then make the short journey to the Capitoline Hill

The Capitoline Hill is among the most famous of the Seven Hills of Rome. Once home to the ancient **Temple of the Capitoline Triad**, which now lies buried into the rock, it has since taken on another purpose. Its Palazzo Senatorio, designed by Michelangelo , lies at the heart of Roman politics, flanked by the famous Capitoline Museums and their unparalleled ancient collections.

Pause to take in the night view of the Roman Forum

The Capitoline Hill affords Rome's best view of the **Roman Forum**. This vast meeting space in the valley between the Palatine and the Capitoline was truly the pulsating political and economic heart of ancient Rome.

Journey past the Imperial Forums to the Colosseum

Running along the Via dei Fori Imperiali are a number of other public spaces built by successive Roman emperors. We'll marvel at the incredible **Trajan's Column**, a triumphal monument illustrating the emperor's victorious campaigns against the Dacians, and **Trajan's Market** - the world's first shopping mall. Our night walk will take us past the imposing **Temple of Mars the Avenger** in the **Forum of Augustus**, dedicated after Augustus had avenged the murder of his father - Julius Caesar.

The adventure concludes at the Roman Colosseum

Your exclusive VIP access grants you direct access to the Colosseum Arena where your guide will bring the bloody stories of its combatants to life. Then we descend into the darkness of the Colosseum Underground to learn more about engineering ingenuity and mechanisms of this majestic arena. Catacombs & the Appian Way Tour - Private Tour



- Escape Rome's bustling center for a calming countryside retreat.
- Marvel at the monuments and tombs lining this ancient road.
- Descend into a catacomb's depths to explore underground Rome.

The **Catacombs and Appian Way Tour** takes you on a journey down the **Via Appia Antica**, the oldest and most **legendary road** leading to Rome. Driving down it is a **sensory treat**. Surrounded by millennia-old monuments and folding green fields, the Appian Way is perhaps the only place in Rome where time has stood still for over 2,000 years.

The Appian Way has a rich legacy of **ancient Roman history**. Because burials were forbidden within the city walls, the deceased were brought here to be laid to eternal rest. **Modest inscriptions** stand side by side with **towering burial structures**. Running alongside the road are several catacombs, each of which houses thousands of ancient remains.

Pass by the Circus of Maxentius and Mausoleum of Romulus.

This **enormous imperial palace** stood safely outside the city. It was the home of the emperor **Maxentius**, **rival** (and ultimate victim) of the emperor **Constantine**. One of the best preserved structures in Rome, the site also contains the **Mausoleum of Romulus**, Maxentius' son, who died tragically young by drowning in the Tiber.

Journey down the Appian Way.

This beautiful country road is lined with pine trees, large green pastures, ancient monuments. Traveling down it you can easily forget how close you are to Rome's center. But although you're surrounded by life, don't forget about the miles of catacombs beneath you. For the last part of the tour, we'll be visiting one of these.

Descend into the depths of one of the Appian Way Catacombs.

Burials along the **Appian Way** date back to the earliest days of Rome. But the most atmospheric and worthwhile Catacombs were early **Christian** cemeteries. You'll be visiting one of these, exploring their darkened corridors with your expert guide. The bodies are long gone, but the catacombs make for a **fascinating visit**, **helping us understand** the importance of Christianity in ancient Rome. Some are heavily **decorated** while others are plain, an indication of the hierarchy of the catacombs.
