Developmental Disability WA

Australian Marine Conservation Society

A massive German **industrial saltworks project** planned at the Exmouth Gulf has been **cancelled**. Had it gone ahead, the project would have devastated the wetlands and marine ecosystems of the Exmouth Gulf. This win is due in no small part to AMCS's continued pressure and campaigning, particularly their Protect Ningaloo campaign; and it is an **inspirational victory** for conservationist groups everywhere.

Yued Aboriginal Corporation

Yued Aboriginal Corporation, in conjunction with the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions, has begun developing a **Joint Management Agreement** across conservation areas within the Yued Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA). This is an important step in the journey to ensure that Yued people have a say in the way that their land is managed and used.

On the 2nd of June, WA Forest Alliance and the Wilderness Society saw almost **2,000 people** march through Perth and <u>rally before Parliament</u>

<u>House</u> for the culmination of the collaborative 10-day **Big Jarrah Walk**. The event saw not only passionate protest, but also music and speeches from

campaigners and politicians, all in a fantastic effort to bring public attention to the issue of destructive mining practices in WA's jarrah forests.
