# **TENANT NEWS**

# **Perth Inner City Youth Service**

PICYS has recently announced the PICYS Legacy Project, in collaboration with Pride Professionals, aimed at tackling youth homelessness in Perth. Their goal is to raise \$400,000+ by November 2025 to fund the purchase of a two-bedroom unit. Click here to make a donation to the PICYS Legacy Project!

This unit will become part of the PICYS Household Network Program. It will provide additional stable housing and wraparound support for homeless and at-risk youth in Perth. This initiative is part of their existing two-year plan to purchase six two-bedroom units in Perth, which will be matched by the Department of Communities, so that at the end of the initiative PICYS will have **24 new beds** to support vulnerable young people in Perth.

# **Pregnancy to Parenthood (P2P)**

We would like to extend a warm welcome to our new tenant, Pregnancy to Parenthood (P2P).

They are dedicated to fostering strong, nurturing early relationships between parents and their babies (0-3), transforming family trajectories, and creating lasting intergenerational change.

They achieve this through accessible, specialised parent and infant mental health (PIMH) programs, compassionate expert practitioners, and advocacy.

In late August, P2P received significant long-term funding from the Stan Perron Charitable Foundation to support their specialised services. This generosity has given them the capacity to expand their services to even more families, and they are very excited to move into City West Lotteries House to provide a home base for P2P.

### **WA Forest Alliance & The Wilderness Society**

Over the past 12 weeks, WA Forest Alliance and The Wilderness Society, as part of the End Forest Mining Alliance, have run a massive community campaign against Alcoa's bauxite mining expansion plans in the Northern Jarrah Forest. As a result of incredible community support, they have broken the EPA's record with more than 59,000 submissions sent to the authority rejecting Alcoa's plans.

They have also successfully <u>had a greenwashing complaint held up by</u> <u>AdStandards</u>, which saw Alcoa's advertising about its NJF rehabilitation labelled as inaccurate and likely to mislead or deceive. This has been a monumental campaign moment, and a wonderful demonstration of what has been achieved with collaboration between organisations here in CWLH.

# **Allergy Support Hub**

In the first week of September, Monique Kerr and Emma Warner from Allergy Support Hub attended the **Australasian Society of Clinical Immunology and Allergy (ASCIA) Conference** in Brisbane.

Representing ASH, they delivered mental health training for allergy

health professionals (for which they received excellent feedback!), and presented two posters outlining their work in WA.

They were one of two recipients of a prize for one of their posters, which detailed the outcomes of their Telethon-funded Allergy Brave Program, a brief psychological intervention program for children with allergies in WA. They also spoke about the mental health impacts of allergies in teens and young adults. The event was a wonderful opportunity to share their work with other health professionals who were grateful and interested to hear about their contributions to the field.

# **Australian Marine Conservation Society**

Premier Roger Cook announced recently that the WA government will be creating a marine park across the entire Exmouth Gulf, thus greatly strengthening its environmental protections. This comes after lengthy and vigorous campaigning by AMCS, in particular the Protect Ningaloo campaign run by their WA branch. The marine park "will be jointly managed with Nyinggulu Traditional Owners", and its establishment represents an enormous victory along the long journey of advocacy that Protect Ningaloo has been endeavouring along for years.

This news comes quite recently after the cancellation of a **major saltworks projec**t in the Exmouth area, which was another milestone for Protect Ningaloo. Already this year, it has been amazing to see how persistent work and campaigning by AMCS has resulted in such monumental victories.

### <u>DDWA</u>

DDWA is in the pilot stage for a **new program** for people with intellectual and communication disability to **build communication and self-advocacy skills**, entitled **the** *Voice and Choice* **project**. The project is set to run until June 2027. Additionally, through a Department of Communities Grant, DDWA was able to offer a **sponsorship of up to \$1,000** for a support organisation to hold inclusive community events or activities on or around the 3rd December, for the International Day of

People with Disability 2025. The theme for this year is "Celebrating our Unity", which recognises that "by working together we achieve better outcomes for people of all abilities, and thereby honours the knowledge and experience of people with disability."

# **Special Olympics of WA**

Special Olympics WA invites you to be part of the **2025 State Games**, with athletics, bocce, basketball, golf, netball, swimming, and tennis taking place 18–19 October at WA Athletics Centre and Bendat Basketball Centre. Entries are open to athletes with intellectual disability and/or autism who train regularly in sport, while families, friends, and the wider community are warmly encouraged to spectate free of charge.
