

Our aims for this project are:

- Encourage new activities / groups to be set up, and further develop networks for autistic adults, and for families supporting autistic children
- Support venues to develop visual stories and offer training for their staff on autism and neurodivergence



Our training offer

We will be delivering 10 training workshops for shops, businesses and services across Surrey – this will be 2 workshops in each of the 5 areas.



We are planning to start promoting the training workshops during August 2025 to start in the autumn

Jo has been working hard setting up a facebook group for Autism Friendly Communities across Surrey




We plan to launch this group in June 2025. It will be for anyone interested in helping to make communities more autism friendly.

Different autistic people find different types of cinema showings meet their needs:



For example:

- Relaxed performances often appeal to families as children moving around and making noise is tolerated
- Many adults simply choose to go to the cinema to see a standard performance at quieter times
- Some cinemas even have over 18's showings of animated films


