



Orlando, Florida, is renowned for its pleasant and tropical climate. The city experiences a humid subtropical climate, characterized by hot, humid summers and mild, dry winters. During the summer months, which span from June to September, temperatures often soar into the high 80s to mid-90s Fahrenheit (around 30-35°C), accompanied by afternoon thunderstorms that provide a refreshing break from the heat. Winters, from December to February, are mild and comfortable, with temperatures ranging from the 60s to 70s Fahrenheit (15-25°C). Rainfall is relatively evenly distributed throughout the year, making Orlando lush and green. Overall, visitors can expect warm and sunny weather for most of the year, making it an appealing destination regardless of the season.

Most places (Orlando included) experience a variety of visitor "seasons". I characterize these seasons as "peak", "value" and "shoulder". Finding the best time of year to visit for you, depends on your circumstances. I personally love visiting Orlando in February.

VIA AIR TO SANFORD
















































This curated itinerary features some of my favorite on the beaten path spots in Orlando. These are my choices presented for your consideration. In addition, I've been quite generous with the timing of each entry, so take this trip at your pace. You'll find in the coming pages two travel days (inbound and out) and three full days in Orlando. Remember, I am not a huge fan of scheduling ANYTHING on a travel day because air travel can be unpredictable. Enjoy your trip!



The Travel Day

One of my most favorite "travel tips/rules" is: respect the travel day. Book a direct flight if at all possible and preferably the first flight of the day from your home airport. If driving or taking the train, then try to arrive at noon. Pack a carry on only if possible. At the time of your booking or a few days before your travel day, call your hotel and request an early check in. The travel day is not agenda-driven. I believe it should be used to acclimate to your temporary environment. Just relax...you're on vacation and remember, sightseeing starts tomorrow.

Mid Day - Hotel Check In

It is critical you book a room you love. In other words, do not "cheap out" on the accommodations! This is the room you are going to go to sleep in (and wake up in) on every day of your getaway. Select a property for your reasons. I like properties within walking distance of a few attractions or restaurants I know I want to try. I look for well-lit side streets in popular neighborhoods. I rarely stay on HIGH RISE top floors and I avoid the ground floor if possible. If I have an option, then I prefer to not book accommodations at a property with room doors facing the outdoors.



Your Orlando getaway starts with a world class theme park. I have written a separate article listing some of my suggestions. But understand, the day will be long, hot and (depending on the time of year) crowded.

Breakfast at the Hotel

In my estimation, a good breakfast on a busy and active day sets the tone. Get some fried eggs and bacon! Enjoy a coffee and don't forget the water.

9:00am - 6:00pm

Theme Park Day

Order Tickets Online and In Advance

Pick the theme park that best suits your needs. My first visit to Orlando came with a full day visit to The Magic Kingdom. Over the years, I've done Universal trips and Disney trips...it's really up to you.

Get your tickets in advance and arrive as early as possible. Prioritize what you wish to see and do and go for it!

Lunch should be kept light and in whatever theme part you are visiting.

Unless you are specifically staying in the park for a show, then try to depart the park around 5:00pm ET.

7:00pm - 9:00pm

Disney Springs

Dinner at The BOATHOUSE - Disney Springs

Dining at The BOATHOUSE® in Disney Springs offers an upscale waterfront experience that combines fresh seafood, premium steaks, and nautical charm. Situated along Lake Buena Vista, this restaurant features vintage dream boats from the 1930s to 1950s and offers options for both indoor and dockside seating. 7:00am - 10:00am

Hot Air Ballooon Expedition & Brunch

10:00am - 1:00pm

Wild Florida - Animal Park

1:00pm - 1:30pm

Light Lunch at the Hotel

Pool Time or Outlet Mall Shopping

At this point I'd most-likely want an afternoon to lounge by the pool. So do that, or walk along Duvall Street, pop into the shops and just take it all in.

6:30pm - 9:00pm

Dinner and a Show - The Speakeasy Murder

8:00am - 9:00am

Breakfast In Bed

Let the hotel staff cater to your every breakfast whim. Enjoy lounging in your robe as a delicious selection of pastries, fresh fruit and delicious coffee are served to you in your room.

9:00am - 3:00pm

Kennedy Space Center

Visiting the Kennedy Space Center offers an awe-inspiring journey into the history and future of space exploration, with captivating exhibits on NASA's iconic missions, including the Apollo moon landings. Expect to witness actual space shuttles, experience interactive astronaut encounters, and marvel at the vastness of the cosmos in this immersive and educational space center.

This includes lunch at the Orbit Cafe or Space Bowl Bistro. You may want to attend a meet & greet with a real astronaut!

3:00pm - 7:00pm

Afternoon at Your Leisure

Getting back to the hotel in the middle of the afternoon allows for a little downtime before the evening. This could be spent shopping, window shopping, napping or lounging by the pool.

7:00pm - 9:00pm

Dinner and a Show - The Pirate's Dinner Adventure

Embark on a thrilling voyage at Pirates Dinner Adventure in Orlando, where a fully rigged 18th-century pirate ship serves as the stage for an action-packed evening of entertainment and dining. Set within an indoor lagoon, this interactive show features daring sword fights, aerial acrobatics, and a captivating storyline that invites audience participation, making it an engaging experience for guests of all ages. Orlando, famous for its theme parks and attractions, also offers a plethora of free activities and sights, making it an ideal destination for budget-conscious travelers.
