Be prepared to give the call taker the:

Shelter information

Evacuation routes

Location of the emergency (street address)

In the event of an emergency, call **2-1-1** for:

Points of distribution (PODs)

Disaster relief information

- Phone number you are calling from (in case you get disconnected)
- Nature of the emergency
- Physical description of the situation

If dialed by mistake, explain what happened to the call taker. Do NOT hang up.

- 23. Call **8-1-1** Before You Dig—Free service, call 48 hours prior to any digging to have buried lines marked
- 24. **Local governments**—Check to see if your city offers classes or holds Citizen Corps Council meetings.
 - **Sandy Citizen Corps Council** meets on the 2nd Thursday at 7:00 p.m. in the multipurpose room at Sandy City Hall. All residents are welcome to attend.
