Key Scriptures: 2 Cor. 5:10-11, Hebrews 9:27-28, Rom. 2:6-11, Rev. 20:11-15, John 14:1-6

Key Scriptures: Matthew 18:23-35, Matthew 6:14-15, 1 John 4:20-21

While forgiving others does not excuse their behavior, it releases us from the power their behavior once had over us.

You can forgive, you can release the past and you can be free. This is all through your love relationship with the Lord and growth in Him. Hide yourself in the love and mercy of your Heavenly Father.

If your heart is still pricked when you hear the name of someone who hurt you, it is time to forgive. This is the day to lay down all debts owed to you, and find freedom from the bondage of unforgiveness. This is the day to forgive, once and for all, from your heart!
