Our Conductor

Kit Mitchell learned to sing at his mother's knee and was dispatched at the age of eight to be a Chorister in Durham Cathedral choir, where he experienced an intensive grounding in musicianship and the church music tradition, and learned the craft of choral singing.

He sang in St Ann's Church Choir, Manchester as a student, and with Manchester University Gilbert & Sullivan Society; later with Wokingham Choral Society under Stephen Layton, and later still with Dunblane Cathedral Choir and Stirling University Choir.

In 2015, under the expert guidance of his teacher, Catriona Lang BMus (Hons) PGDIP, Kit achieved a Distinction at Grade 8 in the practical Singing exam of the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music.

A member of the Association of British Choral Directors, Kit was Assistant Conductor of Stirling University Choir from 2016 to 2022, leading sectionals, warm-ups, and deputising as accompanist and as conductor as required, including conducting performances of Haydn's Little Organ Mass and Faure's Requiem.

Kit has been the Music Director of ClacksChoral since January 2023.

Our Accompanist

Meg Carroll ALCM was born in Dumbarton and raised in Helensburgh. She started piano lessons at the age of 5, progressing to playing harmonium for Sunday School and piano for Brownies, Guides and ballet classes by the age of 12.

Leaving school after O-levels, Meg enrolled in a secretarial college in Glasgow, which led to a career in administration, including at Alva Academy, Stirling University, NCH and Grounds for Learning.

She continued to study music privately and joined Girlguiding in Alva and the Scottish Singing Circle. Thus she had the opportunity to try the clarsach and was hooked. She joined Edinburgh-based *Na Clarsairean* and has since played in many venues, including Holyrood Palace, the Scottish Parliament, Scone Palace and Iona Abbey. Performing with a friend in the National Mod, they won the adult duet competition two years in a row.

She learned violin at school and unearthed the instrument after many years' neglect and now plays with Stirling Strathspey and Reel Society. Flute playing also took her fancy and she often plays with friends in small groups.

Meg is also an active member of Stirling and District Society of Organists and the Organist at Menstrie Parish Church.

Formerly and occasionally our relief accompanist, Meg joined us permanently in September 2022 and is now an integral and essential contributor to our music-making going forward.
