Catriona enjoys singing a wide variety of repertoire and, during her time at the Conservatoire, appeared in numerous operas, opera scenes, 'Lieder Abend's and musicals, most notably performing the main roles of Calisto in Cavalli's La Calisto at the Crescent Theatre in Birmingham, and Eileen in Bernstein's Wonderful Town. Catriona was a member of The National Youth Choir of Scotland (NYCoS) for 9 years and features as a soloist on two of their CDs. She has also appeared as soprano soloist in Mozart's *Requiem* and Vivaldi's *Gloria* with Stirling City Choir. Although Catriona loves to perform, she also finds teaching greatly rewarding, and was the singing teacher at both Coventry University and Birmingham's "Spotlight Stage School" for many years, as well as leading music sessions for babies and toddlers.

In 2011, Catriona moved back to Stirling, where she now offers private singing tuition and works with the NYCoS Stirling Area Choir and NYCoS Mini Music Makers. Since her return to Stirling, Catriona has appeared as a soloist in venues such as the Church of the Holy Rude, The Tolbooth and the Albert Hall, and has also led vocal workshops for several local choirs.
