#### Our Conductor

Mike also appears regularly as a silent film pianist throughout Scotland, most recently at the Hippodrome Festival of Silent Cinema in Bo'ness, and has improvised the soundtracks for a number of commercial and Scottish Screen Archive DVD releases.

## Our Guest Soloist: Richard Montgomery

Richard Montgomery began studying violin with his current teacher Andrea Gajic at the age of six. Since then he has participated in many competitions including the BBC Young Musician of the Year in which he progressed to the Category Auditions in 2013. He has won six classes in the Edinburgh Competition Festival including the Gray Medal and the Winifred Gavine Medal for the solo strings ten and fifteen minute recitals respectively.

In 2010 Richard gained a place at St Mary's Music School in Edinburgh where he has presently entered his final year. Through his studies there he has developed his musicianship and found a love for music-making which has compelled him to pursue a career in this field.

In recent years, Richard has been involved in numerous chamber music projects which have propelled his performing experiences to a broader level. In 2015 he performed in the Edinburgh Fringe Festival playing Schubert's string quintet and a new work by Tom David Wilson written especially for the ensemble.

Richard has performed in various masterclasses around Britain and abroad. He has worked with some of the world's leading artists including Felix Andrievsky, Nicola Benedetti, Jan Repko and Viktor Tretyakov. He will be returning to Sirmione this July to attend another course of study with maestro Tretyakov.

As of September 2016 Richard will commence his tertiary education at the Royal Academy of Music, London.
