Michael Nolan was born in Croydon in 1961 but has lived in Scotland since 1969. As one of the first music students to attend St. Mary's Music School in Edinburgh, he studied composition with Hugh MacDonald and Geoffrey King, piano with Colin Kingsley and organ with De nnis Townhill. He went on to study piano and composition for several years with the composer-pianist Ronald Stevenson.



During the next two decades he worked in theatre, community music and arts development and read film and media studies at the University of Stirling. Most recently, he trained as a music therapist and now has his own private practice based in Dunblane, where he lives, and is also organist at St. Blane's Church. Mike also appears regularly as a silent film pianist throughout Scot land, most recently at the Hippodrome Festival of Silent Cinema in Bo'ness, and has improvised the soundtracks for a number of commercial and Scottish Screen Archive DVD releases.

Our Accompanist

The society is thrilled to introduce our new accompanist, **Ben Eames**.

Ben is a classical pianist who currently performs both as a soloist and with chamber ensembles throughout Scotland. He has performed in a variety of venues in Scotland including The Queens Hall, Edinburgh; Falkirk Town Hall: Albert Halls. Stirling: Stockbridge Parish Church



Town Hall; Albert Halls, Stirling; Stockbridge Parish Church, Edinburgh and the Edinburgh Society of Musicians.

He completed his Masters of Music in piano performance at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance , studying under Douglas Finch. During his time at Trinity Laban, Ben's repertoire focussed primar ily on late 1 9th / early 20th century piano works with particular emphasis on Russian composers. While studying he also worked with the Wren Ensemble performing a chamber reduction of Gustav Mahler's Symphony No. 4 as well as other ensembles. Ben has per formed in venues throughout Greenwich including the Royal Naval College Chapel, St Alfeges Church and King Charles Court.

In July 2014, Ben graduated from the Ian Tomlin School of Music in Edinburgh Napier University with a 1st class Bachelor of Music wit honours studying under Simon Coverdale. During his time at Napier Ben worked extensively with various ensembles performing both classical music ranging from romanticism to 20th century and contemporary popular music. He also frequently worked in collaboration with fellow student composers as part of various concerts and workshops. In November 2013, Ben performed Mozart's Concerto No .21 in C Major, K.467 with the Edinburgh Napier Chamber Orchestra. Whilst at Napier Ben won multiple prizes at the Edinbur gh Competitions Festival including: Horace Fellowes Medal for Chamber Music (2014); Elizabeth Ritchie Medal for 15 Minute Recital (2013); Christina Pentland Medal for Classical Piano Recital (2012) and the Chopin Medal (2012).

Whilst Ben is currently focused on late 19 th / 20th Century classical music his entire repertoire is diverse, ranging from baroque through to romanticism as well. He also works regularly with jazz musicians from Glasgow and Edinburgh arranging standards as well as composing new works.
