Donal T Hurley M.Sc. was born in Waterford in 1960, but lived in Dublin from the age of 8 until, at the age of 23, he abandoned work on a Ph.D. in theoretical physics at University College Dublin for a career in teaching. After over 4 years teaching at Ashwicke Hall in Wiltshire, a Lebanese-owned international boarding school, he transferred to the same company's Abu Dhabi school in 1988, leading their international Physics department until 1997, whereupon a 2-year stint lecturing at UAE University in the oasis city of Al Ain allowed a career highlight to coincide with the life highlight of the births of his two daughters.

Returning to the UK in 1999, a year teaching Maths and Physics at Glenalmond College in rural Perthshire allowed him to complete GTCS registration in those two subjects and join the Scottish state sector, where he continued to teach until retirement in 2020. Though retired, he is still active on supply at Alva Academy.

A scientist by training and inclination, Donal's lifelong passions are nonetheless languages and music. He plays violin and cello and, until assuming the roles of Acting President and Acting Music Director, sang in our basses and served as Publicity Officer, an office he still retains. He is also a reviewer contributing to the Edinburgh Music Review online, as well as an activist in the EIS trade union and various other roles in pursuit of social justice.
