A house is more than a house. It's a home. It's a refuge. It's often the place we hold most dear. Some even claim it's a castle, no matter how humble.

But the center of the Historical Society is the Crocker House. We have long viewed it as a museum, an event space, a social center, the home to a fabulous garden. And so it is. But we can also view it as a hub for history. In the coming weeks and months we are expanding our programming to include offsite opportunities with community partnerships that we have been building for the past year and more. This will include walking tours, information booths at various events and places in Mount Clemens, and programming geared towards engagement with local youth. This last includes working with partners like the YMCA and the Discovery Center in Mount Clemens, and others who we are building continually building relationships with.

We are also bringing groups into the Crocker House to co host programming as well, with the Mount Clemens Public Library leading the way for summer activities planned.

We have also started our own youth "History Hunt" at the Crocker House, an escape room mystery solved in our own historic venue. There is also an adult version and it shows promise for bringing new audiences on site, and hopefully folks like you who already love the Crocker House.

We are building outward, but have not forgotten "the hub" that is the Crocker House. While we are working with partners, and exploring new programs in the community, we are reappraising how we interpret our house and our local history. On the exhibit front we are building out a Fire Department history display and have designs on revamping some of our current interpretation.

In addition we have recently added our first specialty tour in the house, "The Back of House Tour," which despite the name is a whole house tour, but focused on the domestic work, and workers that would have been in the Crocker House in the 19th and early 20th Century. The first members only tour is 6 pm on June 6th (the first night of our Garage Sale!) with more to follow.

As I mentioned above we are going to continue to add to our schedule all year as opportunity and planning come together. My last piece here is an invitation to you: if you are a member of a group who loves Mount Clemens reach out to us, see how we can work together to improve both the Crocker House, and our city. Together we can fashion a better future in our own historic "hub" and the wider community we are a part of.








The Healing Waters of Mount Clemens: A Look Back at the Mineral Bath Era


In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, Mount Clemens earned the moniker "Bath City of America," attracting visitors from across the nation to experience its renowned mineral baths. The discovery of these therapeutic waters can be traced back to 1865 when the first well was drilled in an attempt to produce salt. While the salt production endeavor was short-lived due to the water's unique mineral composition, the potential health benefits of the mineral-rich waters soon became evident.

A pivotal moment occurred in 1870 when local mill owner Dorr Kellogg, suffering from a severe case of eczema, sought relief by bathing in the mineral water. After a series of baths, he experienced a remarkable cure, sparking interest in the water's curative properties. Recognizing the potential, Dr. Henry Taylor, a local physician, established the first bathhouse in 1873, aptly named "The Original." This facility marked the beginning of Mount Clemens' transformation into a bustling spa destination.

As word of the healing waters spread, the city saw a surge in the construction of bathhouses and hotels to accommodate the influx of health seekers. By the early 20th century, Mount Clemens boasted numerous establishments catering to visitors, including the Medea Bath House, built in 1882, and the Park Bath House, established in 1886. These facilities offered luxurious accommodations and a range of therapeutic services, solidifying the city's reputation as a premier health resort.



Cutter's Guide to Mount Clemens (1893–1916) promoted the city's famous mineral baths, listing bathhouses, hotels, transportation, and recreation for visitors seeking healing waters.

bath era remains a significant chapter in the city's rich history.

The mineral baths attracted a diverse clientele, from everyday individuals seeking relief from ailments to celebrities and public figures. Notable visitors included Clark Gable, Mae West, Babe Ruth, Jack Dempsey, and William Randolph Hearst, all drawn to the reputed healing powers of the baths.

However, with the advent of modern medicine and changing public health practices, the popularity of the mineral baths began to wane. By the mid-20th century, many of the bathhouses had closed their doors, and the once-thriving industry faded into history. Today, while the original bathhouses no longer operate, the legacy of Mount Clemens' mineral
