




### MACOMB COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY CROCKER HOUSE MUSEUM & GARDENS

# What is tables caping?"

Tablescaping or table decorating is defined as "the act of creatively and intentionally arranging a tabletop so that it conveys a specific theme, mood, or experience." It includes arranging items on a table in an attractive and decorative way, often with matching plates, bowls, etc. and adding things such as napkins, flowers, and candles. In the case of the pottery lunch, it includes a centerpiece and decorations that convey the theme for your table.

Nina Hendrick of Nina Hendrick Home provides the following tips and ideas to decorate a table:

1.) Find Your Inspiration.

This year's pottery lunch theme "My Favorite Things," lends itself to an infinite variety of ideas. What is your favorite thing? Examples could be flowers, birds, a hobby, food. The options are endless and reflect what you like.

- 2.) Consider your event. What size is the table, how many guests will you have? Zuccaro's banquet tables are 66 inch round and seat eight guests. Zuccaro's does provide a white table cloth with each table. If you chose to add your own tablecloth, a 120" round would reach to the floor and 108" will also work well.
- 3.) Gather your materials: Basics: dishes, flatware, charger plates, glasses, napkins, tablecloth

You will need:

8 luncheon or dinner size plates

8 cups and saucers

8 salad or dessert plates

Centerpiece

A small table favor for your guests (i.e. candy, candle)

Please no paper or plastic plates. Thank you!

Optional: Stemware, chargers, flatware (Zuccaro's does provide flatware), sugar & creamer, salt & pepper shakers, napkins, tablecloth.

#### 4.) Centerpiece

This is where your creativity will shine. The purpose of the centerpiece is to showcase your favorite thing, whatever it may be. The centerpiece may be simple or complex. It is entirely up to you. As an example, are flowers your favorite thing? Then a lovely arrangement of flowers placed in the center of the table makes for a simple, but elegant centerpiece. You can add candlesticks, flower themed favors or whatever else you chose to decorate your table.



#### 5.) Create your place setting

Begin with your charger or placemat, then a plate. From there add any additional items, a salad plate, possibly a favor for your guests. Napkins may be placed on top of the plates with a pretty fold or a napkin ring. Utensil may be arranged around the charger or wrapped in the napkin.

#### 6.) Chair Decorations

Although not necessary, you can also decorate the chairs which add a little something extra to your design. Chair covers, tied ribbons, wrapped lace sashes, hats or small wreaths all work.
