Course Fees:

There is a \$25 non-refundable registration fee to save space, which is applied to the total cost of the course. Each 1.5 hour course is \$15 a week, but payment for all 7 weeks is due on or before the first day of classes. The total fee is \$105 (minus the \$25 fee) per class, which can be paid by check, cash, or online.

Courses will be small groups with 5-15 students in each. Please note, the minimum enrollment is 5 students.
