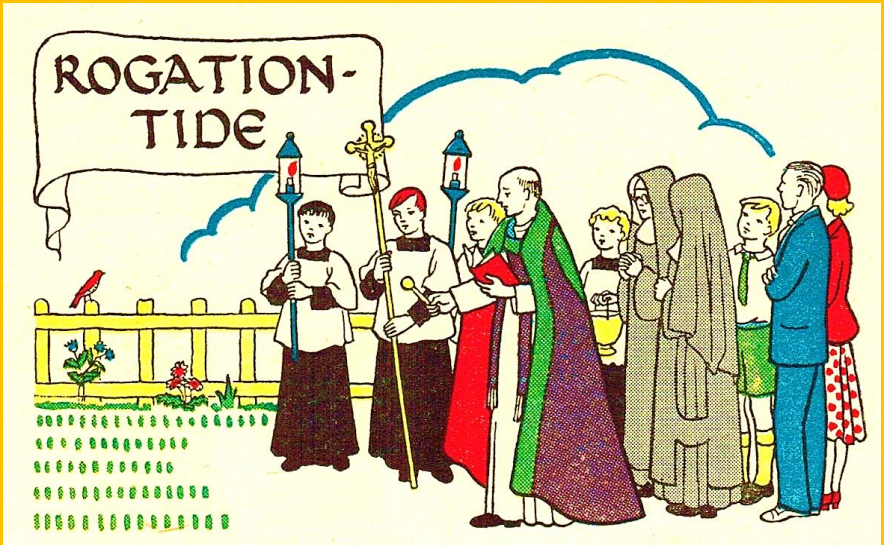

The Epistle – *Wisdom vii. 7-14*

Epistoller: I CALLED upon God, and the spirit of wisdom came to me. I preferred her before sceptres and thrones, and esteemed riches nothing in comparison of her. Neither compared I unto her any

precious stone, because all gold in respect of her is as a little sand, and silver shall be counted as clay before her. I loved her above health and beauty, and chose to have her instead of light: for the light that cometh from her never goeth out. All good things together came to me with her, and innumerable riches in her hands. And I rejoiced in them all, because wisdom goeth before them: and I knew not that she was the mother of them. I learned diligently, and do communicate her liberally: I do not hide her riches. Secreta

Returning to face the Altar, the Celebrant prays silently:

RECEIVE O Lord, the prayers and oblations of thy faithful people: that through this service of our loving devotion we may attain unto heavenly glory. Through...

TROUGH thy mercy, O Lord, and the intercession of blessed MARY, ever-Virgin, may this oblation further our prosperity and peace, both now and forever.

DEFEND us, O Lord, who wait upon thy mysteries: that we, cleaving to heavenly things, may serve thee both in mind and body. Through...

The Prayer for the Church *(kneel)*

The Secret Prayer concluded, the Celebrant bids the People to prayer, kneeling:

Let us pray for the whole state of Christ's Church.

Almighty and Ever-living God, Who by Thy Holy Apostle hast taught us to make prayers and supplications, and to give thanks for all men; We humbly beseech Thee most mercifully to accept our (alms and) oblations, and to receive these our prayers, which we offer unto Thy Divine Majesty; Beseeching Thee to inspire continually the Universal Church with the spirit of truth, unity and concord: And grant that all those who do confess Thy Holy Name may agree in the truth of Thy Holy Word, and live in unity and godly love.

We beseech Thee also, so to direct and dispose the hearts of all Christian Rulers, that they may truly and impartially administer justice, to the punishment of wickedness and vice, and to the maintenance of Thy true religion, and virtue. Give grace, O heavenly Father, to all Bishops, Priest and Deacons that they may, both by their life and doctrine, set forth Thy true and lively Word, and rightly and duly administer Thy Holy Sacraments.

And to all Thy people give Thy heavenly Grace; and especially to this congregation here present; that, with meek heart and due reverence, they may hear, and receive Thy Holy Word; truly serving Thee in holiness and righteousness all the days of their life. And we most humbly beseech Thee, of Thy goodness, O Lord, to comfort and succor all those who, in this transitory life, are in trouble, sorrow, need, sickness, or any other adversity (*especially N. and N.*).

And we also ✠ bless Thy Holy Name for all Thy servants departed this life in Thy faith and fear; beseeching Thee to grant them continual growth in Thy love and service, and to give us Grace so to follow their good examples, that with them we may be partakers of Thy heavenly Kingdom. Grant this, O Father, for JESUS Christ's sake, our only Mediator and Advocate. *Amen.*

The Exhortation, General Confession, and Absolution

Ye who do truly and earnestly repent you of your sins, and are in love and charity with your neighbors, and intend to lead a new life, following the commandments of God, and walking from henceforth in His holy ways; Draw near with faith and take this Holy Sacrament to your comfort; And make your humble confession to Almighty God, devoutly kneeling.

...Father of our Lord JESUS Christ, Maker of all things, Judge of all men; We acknowledge and bewail our manifold sins and wickedness, Which we, from time to time, most grievously have committed, By thought, word and deed, Against Thy Divine Majesty, Provoking most justly Thy wrath and indignation against us. We do earnestly repent, And are heartily sorry for these our misdoings; The remembrance of them is grievous unto us; the burden of them is intolerable. Have mercy upon us, Have mercy upon us, most merciful Father; For Thy Son our Lord JESUS Christ's sake, Forgive us all that is past; And grant that we may ever hereafter serve and please Thee in newness of life; To the honor and glory of Thy Name; Through JESUS Christ our Lord. Amen.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, Who of His great mercy hath promised forgiveness of sins to all those who with hearty repentance and true faith turn unto Him: Have mercy upon you ✠ pardon and deliver you from all your sins; confirm and strengthen you in all goodness; and bring you to everlasting Life; through JESUS Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

The Comfortable Words

Hear what comfortable words our Saviour Christ saith unto all who truly turn to Him.

Come unto me, all ye that are heavy laden, and I will refresh you.

God so loved the world, that He gave his only begotten Son, to the end that all that believe in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

It is very meet, right and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God. But chiefly are we bound to praise Thee for the glorious Resurrection of thy Son JESUS Christ our Lord: for he is the very Pascal Lamb, which was offered for us, and hath taken away the sin of the world; who by His death hath destroyed death, and by His rising to life again hath restored to us everlasting life. The Canon of the Mass

All glory be to Thee, Almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that Thou, of Thy tender mercy, didst give Thine only Son JESUS Christ to suffer death upon the Cross for our redemption; Who made there (by His one oblation of Himself once offered) a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction for the sins of the whole world; And did institute, and in His Holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual

memory of that His precious Death and Sacrifice, until His coming again: For in the night in which He was betrayed, He took bread; and when He had given thanks, He brake it, and gave it to His disciples, saying, Take, eat, **THIS IS MY BODY WHICH IS GIVEN FOR YOU.** Do this in remembrance of Me. ✠ Likewise after supper, He took the cup; and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of this: **FOR THIS IS MY BLOOD OF THE NEW TESTAMENT WHICH IS SHED FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE REMISSION OF SINS:** Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of Me. ✠

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, according to the institution of Thy dearly beloved Son our Saviour JESUS Christ, we, Thy humble servants, do celebrate and make here before Thy Divine Majesty, with these Thy Holy Gifts, which we now offer unto Thee, the memorial Thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance His blessed Passion and precious Death, His mighty Resurrection and glorious Ascension; rendering unto Thee most hearty thanks for the innumerable benefits procured unto us by the same.

And we most humbly beseech Thee, O merciful Father, to hear us; and, of Thy almighty goodness, vouchsafe to bless and sanctify, with Thy Word and Holy Spirit, these Thy gifts and creatures of Bread and Wine; that we, receiving them according to Thy Son our Saviour JESUS Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of His Death and Passion, may be partakers of His most blessed Body and Blood.

And we earnestly desire Thy fatherly goodness, mercifully to accept this our Sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching Thee to grant that, by the merits and death of Thy Son JESUS Christ, and through faith in His Blood, we, and all Thy whole Church, may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of His Passion.

And here we offer and present unto Thee, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy and living sacrifice unto Thee; humbly beseeching Thee, that we, and all others who shall be partakers of this Holy Communion, may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of Thy Son JESUS Christ, be filled with thy grace ✠ and heavenly benediction, and made one body with Him, that He may dwell in us, and we in Him.

Remember, Lord, also the souls of Thy servants and handmaidens, which are gone before us in the mark of faith, and who rest in the sleep of peace. (*We pause in silence for a moment and each person remembers before the Lord the faithful departed.*) We beseech Thee, O Lord, that unto them, and unto all such as rest in Christ, Thou wilt grant a place of refreshment, of light, and of peace. And vouchsafe unto us Thy servants, hoping of the multitude of Thy mercies, some portion and fellowship with Thy holy Apostles and Martyrs; with John, Stephen, Matthias, Barnabas, Ignatius, Alexander, Marcellinus, Peter, Felicitas, Perpetua, Agatha, Lucy, Agnes, Cecilia, Anastasia, and with all Thy Saints: Within whose fellowship we beseech Thee to admit us.

And although we are unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto Thee any sacrifice; yet we beseech Thee to accept this our bounden duty and service, not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offenses, through JESUS Christ our Lord; By Whom, and with Whom and in Whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honour and glory be unto Thee, O Father Almighty, world without end.

*If you are baptised and a practicing Christian, you are invited to this Holy Sacrament to share in the Body and Blood of the Lord. We ask all ladies to please remove their lipstick, and we ask all if you receive the Host in the hand, to please remove your gloves. DO NOT HANDLE THE HOST WITH YOUR FINGERS. If receiving the Host by your hand, please cup your hands and place the Host in your mouth simply by raising your cupped hands to your mouth. After receiving the Blessed Sacrament, reply by saying: **Amen**.*
