Annual Out of the Darkness Walk Set for Sept. 28

MACOMB, IL -- To raise awareness, help people talk openly about suicide and provide resources and assistance to those in need, the ninth annual Out of the Darkness (OotD) Walk, which is held each year during or near Suicide Prevention Awareness Month, will be held Saturday, Sept. 28, beginning on the front lawn of Macomb's City Hall.

Susan Vick Denecke of Macomb is the coordinator of the Macomb event, working with the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, to shed light on suicide. Denecke's son, Adam, died by suicide at the age of 27 on Feb. 2, 2016. Denecke formed the first Macomb Out of the Darkness Walk in Fall 2016 to honor Adam's memory and help others. Each year, Adam's friends and family gather together along with many others who have been impacted by suicide to remember their friends and loved ones and to share messages of hope. The Litchfield family, who lost their husband and father, Randy, to suicide in February 2016, lead the walk. **See OOTD on page 2**

To register prior to Sept. 28, visit afsp.org/ MacombIL. On-site registration will begin at 9 a.m. Sept. 30, followed by a brief program and walk around the square at 10 a.m. Resource tables will also be set up to provide additional information. There is no cost to participate.

"Please join us Sept. 30 and help save lives and bring hope to those affected by suicide," Denecke said. "The Macomb/McDonough County Out of the Darkness Walk is a journey of remembrance, hope and support. This event is about uniting our communities and providing an opportunity to acknowledge the ways in which suicide and mental health conditions have affected our lives and the lives of those we love and care about."

Ellen (Ellie) Moon will be the keynote speaker at this year's event. A Macomb resident, Moon will share her experiences surrounding mental illness, addiction and loss, and the impact on her loved ones and herself.

In addition to the speakers, like Moon, and the walk itself, numerous resource tables will be set up at the event. Proceeds from the donations raised for the Macomb walk go to the Illinois chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention and the national organization.

Denecke, who is a licensed professional counselor for Eagle View Community Health System, can direct individuals to suicide awareness presentations/speakers available for schools, community groups and other organizations around the region. In addition, Kate Mallory of Regional Office of Education 26, who is a certified Mental Health First Aid Trainer and AFSP volunteer trainer, can provide educational programming within ROE26 districts. 




