Deer prudence: Avoid the urge to swerve during their mating season

Illinois entering peak time of year for crashes involving deer

SPRINGFIELD – Fall in Illinois includes high school football, spectacular scenery as the leaves change colors and... the arrival of deer mating season. The Illinois Department of Transportation and Illinois Department of Natural Resources are reminding motorists to

be alert for deer, which are entering their peak active season, especially at dawn and dusk now through December.

"While your natural instinct is to steer quickly out of the way when you see a deer, remember to not veer suddenly because you could lose control of your vehicle and swerve into another lane or off the road," said Illinois Transportation Secretary Omer Osman. 

back. They also frequently travel in groups so when you see one there likely are others nearby."

In 2022, there were 14,524 crashes involving deer in Illinois. Of those, 13,892 resulted in damage to property or vehicles, while 629 caused injuries. Four of the crashes resulted in fatalities.

Although a collision with a deer can happen any time, Illinois is approaching the time of year when the most crashes with them occur. Last year, more than 40% of crashes involving deer in Illinois occurred in October, November and December, with November being the highest-risk month. Rural areas were the site of more than 70% of crashes involving deer, with most occurring at twilight or nighttime.

#### Safe driving tips for deer-mating season:

- Be aware of your surroundings, especially in areas with deer crossing signs.
- Scan the sides of the road for eye shine the reflection of headlights in their eyes.
- Slow down if you see a deer and anticipate others could be following.
- Prepare for the unexpected. Deer may stop in the middle of the road and not move for oncoming vehicles.
- If a collision is inevitable, don't veer. Try to glance your vehicle off the deer and avoid swerving into the opposite lanes of traffic or off the road.

Deer can often appear suddenly in some surprising environments, so be on alert, slow down and pay attention in areas where they are known to travel.


"Deer are a part of the Illinois landscape, and drivers should be mindful of their presence," said Illinois Department of Natural Resources Director Natalie Phelps Finnie. "Drive cautiously this time of year, especially at dawn and dusk, when deer are particularly active for the fall mating season."

If you hit a deer, pull off to the shoulder, turn on your hazard lights and call 911. Do not exit the vehicle to check on an injured deer or pull it from the road.



#### **WIU School of Music to Perform a Faculty Recital With Cooper and Andrews Oct. 22**

MACOMB, IL - The Western Illinois University School of Music will present a Faculty Recital featuring tenor Alfonzo Cooper, Jr. and organist Linda Andrews at 4 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 22 at the First Presbyterian Church, located at 400 E. Carroll St. in Macomb.

Sharon J. Willis from Atlanta, GA, was commissioned by the First Presbyterian Church to create a composition in honor of C.T. Vivian, a Civil Rights leader from Macomb. This resulted in the creation of a five-movement suite called "Portraits of Peace" that portrays the life and work of C.T. Vivian. The piece was composed for WIU School of Music faculty members, Assistant Professor Alfonzo Cooper Jr., C.T. Vivian diversity teaching scholar in Vocal Performance and Linda Andrews, instructor of Organ.

Willis is an accomplished composer, having created 16 operatic works, extensive choral pieces including anthems, spirituals (both solo and SATB), cantatas and masses. She has also authored nine plays, nine books and several Afrocentric historical narratives. Notably, she re-enacted C.T. Vivian's encounter with Sheriff Jim Clark on the Courthouse steps of Selma, AL, for Vivian's 94th Birthday Celebration.

Previously, Willis served as the Music Department Chair at Clark Atlanta University and Morris Brown College before retiring. Currently, she serves as the Sanctuary Choir Director at Hoosier Memorial U.M.C. Willis has received various honors and awards, including the Distinguished Composer by the National Association of Negro Musicians (NANM), Inc., the Kuumba Award of Arts and Letters presented by Delta Sigma Theta, the Atlanta Music Legends Award by The Atlanta African-American Music Society, the Spiritual Enlightenment Award - Trumpet Awards (2019), Composer of the Year, National Pen Women and the Samuel Johnson Distinguished Music Educator's Award in 2017. She has also received numerous commissions, including from the American Guild of Organists, the Georgia Music Teachers Association and Central State University. Willis holds a doctorate degree of Musical Arts degree from the University of Georgia, a master's degree in Church Music from Scarritt Graduate School, a master's degree

in Music from Georgia State University and a bachelor's degree from Clark College.

Additional organ repertoire performed on the concert will include two works by Florence Price, "Retrospection" and "Adoration," Willis' own "Ascension Suite," Joel Raney's duet for piano and organ based on "Kum Ba Yah," with pianist Gayle Cooper, and solos for tenor voice by Margaret Bonds and Damien Sneed. Concluding the program will be the congregational hymn, "When Peace Like a River." There will be a reception following the program at the church.
