



city's storm sewer system, improving water management and reducing the risk of flooding during heavy rains.

"This project represents a significant investment in the infrastructure that supports our operations," said Molly Hopper, program coordinator for the Western Area Purchasing Coop. "Thanks to the DCEO grant, we are better able to serve our area school districts and upgrade our facility without passing on costs to local schools."

Completed in August 2024, the project ensures safer and more efficient loading and unloading processes, helping WAPC continue to serve its members effectively.

The WAPC program serves 70 area schools, allowing them to combine their purchasing power and receive the lowest prices for products. They work with vendors to seek bids for paper, office supplies, specialty products, athletic supplies and other needed items for school districts.
