

Council to Discuss 2022 Taxes

Macomb aldermen will discuss 2022 property taxes at their city council committee of the whole meeting tonight. The tax information must be submitted to the McDonough County treasurer by the end of the month.

Council members will review a proposed ordinance for the levy and collection of property taxes. They will also discuss an ordinance that would abate any taxes to pay debt service on \$23 million in 2016 waterworks bonds and \$4 million in 2020 infrastructure bonds.

Aldermen may also discuss an ordinance to create a package liquor license and on-premises consumption permit for Sherpa Properties. The company wants to sell package liquor at the Conoco service station on East Jackson Street.

The committee of the whole meeting begins at 5:15 p.m. on the second floor of Macomb City Hall. It may also be viewed on the Macomb YouTube channel, and will also be broadcast beginning Tuesday on cable channel 15.


