CITY COUNCIL PREVIEW

Renee Lotz to be Named City Clerk

The Macomb City Council intends today to vote to appoint Deputy City Clerk Renee Lotz to the top position. City Clerk Melanie Falk said that her previously announced resignation would be effective at the end of the month.

Lotz, who has been Falk's deputy for 11 years, would take office January 1, 2023. She is running for a full four-year term on the April 4 election ballot. Lotz is opposed in the election by Kate Michael-Mattsey.

In other business, aldermen will vote on a new five-year contract with Ryan Hansen for management of Spring Lake Park and Campground. Also scheduled is adoption of ordinances amending the structure of the Macomb/Bushnell Enterprise Zone and authorizing special use permits for first floor residences in the downtown business district. The apartments are located in 129 through 131 and at135 South Lafayette Street.

The city council agenda also includes scheduled votes on renewal of third-party administration, the local agent, and reinsurance for Macomb's employee health insurance plan. Aldermen will also be asked to create a voluntary health insurance plan for part-time city employ-

The council meeting will begin with a public hearing on the package liquor license application of Sherpa Properties at 608 East Jackson Street. Ordinance amendments requiring vacant property registration and establishing a shortterm rental registration program are also on the agenda.

Tonight's city council meeting is scheduled to begin at 5:15 p.m. on the second floor of Macomb City Hall. The meeting may also be viewed on the Macomb YouTube channel, and it will be broadcast beginning Tuesday on cable channel 15.

MDH Announces Start of Covered Walkway Project

McDonough District Hospital announced construction work of Phase 1 of the Covered Walkway project has begun at the main entrance to both Health Services Building 1 & 2.

The project will provide sheltered walkways from the edge of the sidewalk of both buildings to the front doors - helping patients stay out of the elements during inclement weather.

Phase 1 began as the concrete will be replaced from the sidewalk edge leading into each building. Both building main entrances will remain open during the entirety of the project.

Construction will close off half of one side of the walkway entrance, then when that half is complete the other half will close down for the building improvements to better serve patients visiting the MDH campus.

During the course of the construction project, patients can safely enter HSB 1 and HSB 2 through the temporary enclosures.



The majority of work will take place after regular business hours Monday-Friday and also during the weekend.

Phase 2 will consist of the walkway construction. The project is anticipated to conclude next




