



Henderson, McDonough, and Warren counties in Illinois since 1983. Monetary donations made directly to Project Santa added up to over \$42,000, which was sorely needed to help children in the program. In 2022, the agency spent around \$100 on toys and clothing for each child. Through a grant provided by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, the agency was also able to provide some food to each family. Thanks to coat drives and monetary donations, many children were also able to receive a coat and/or winter wear items like scarves and hats.

Project Santa is a non-religious social service program; people of all faiths are welcome to apply. Project Santa gives the gifts to the parents unwrapped, so the parents can have a direct, hands-on experience in giving gifts to their children based on their own family

traditions.

In 2022, WIRC officials say 445 children from 175 households were fully enrolled in the Project Santa program. An additional 81 children from 27 households were assisted in a limited capacity through toy, food and clothing donations.

Project Santa is a massive undertaking both by WIRC team members and volunteers, as it helps hundreds of children across a four-county area each year. Five full days are dedicated only to shopping, and it takes the efforts of many volunteers over several weeks to sort all of the gifts that are purchased. Enrollment for the program typically starts in late-September, and the gifts are distributed to the families in mid-December.

to celebrate reading and cross-community collaborations through the One Book One Community Festival.







# **Tornadoes down Spartans**

ABINGDON, Ill. (Jan. 14, 2023) – The A-Town Tornadoes are a vastly improved varsity basketball team at this point in the season, in comparison to where they were at the start of the season.

Saturday, the Bushnell-Prairie City Spartans learned firsthand just how improved they are in a 58-41 Prairieland Conference loss at Abingdon-Avon High School.

The Tornadoes controlled the game from the jump, using outstanding shooting to open a 16-9 lead at the end of the first quarter, which set the tone for the entire game for A-Town. In fact, they finished the quarter 4-of-4 from the free throw line, and made a pair of threes to help reach their quarter total.

B-PC on the other hand struggled taking care of the basketball in quarter number one, which in turn set the tone for the Spartans for the remainder of the game, as well. Mixed with poor shooting, overall, and B-PC had the start of a long evening.

In the second quarter, however, the Spartans finally did come to life, all-be-it late in the half, behind the scoring of Dalton Strode and Ezra Mason. After trailing by 9 in the second quarter, a late charge made the game 24-22 at the



"...they went with option c," he added. "It's part of wrestling a dual meet.


"(Tremont) inserted people to keep from having forfeits."




