It was the final battle heard around Macomb, as the well-liked novelty shop, Kapow'66 Comics, Toys & Collectibles, closed its doors at 5 East Side Square last Saturday after serving the community for five-plus years.

With well-renowned products, it was an assortment of collections for young and old to feast their eyes on. Couples Jennifer and Monte Anderson offered rare and aspirational gifts to the community. Their most popular products carried, Funko Pops (small figurines of popular cultural icons; characteristics include giant bobbleheads and oversized eyes), were always the first items you saw in their shop, despite their location in the backrows upon rows of Funko Pops. And guess what? You never saw the same Pop figurine twice.

Whether you were into superheroes, cartoons, science fiction (Star Wars, Star Trek), anime/manga or general pop culture, the Andersons had a little bit of everything. The best part: their collections were decently priced.

I personally recall blowing several of my college job checks once they arrived back in the day at Kapow'66. Then whatever action

figure or two or three I would buy, I would place on my Western Courier (Western Illinois University's student newspaper) desk.

I also recall the first time I met Monte. Kapow'66 was on East Jackson Street. Monte had the original Star Trek series on a big flat screen. The atmosphere was calm and relaxing. He didn't follow you around the store, demanding he helped you find something. He always allowed his customers to wander around and approach him with questions. It was a refreshing business strategy.

I noticed right above the register he had an autographed picture of Seth Rollins (a poster child for the most wildly recognized professional wrestling promotion in the world, World Wrestling Entertainment). This autographed picture was no ordinary one; it was an autographed photo of Rollins when won the Money in the Bank Briefcase, a decorative contract that lets a wrestler choose when to cash in and challenge for any title of their choosing in WWE.

I was stunned he had such historic memorabilia. When I asked him how he retrieved such a treasure like this, he admitted through personal connections, he was able to obtain

Continued from page 1 (OSE), host the annual event as part of Western's Family Day, Ag Day and WIU Athletics' Football season.

To participate in the competition, teams/ individuals pay a \$100 entry fee and must bring their own smokers (wood, charcoal, electric or propane) and tents. The University will provide tables, table service for the public tasting portion of the event and electricity, and, thanks to sponsors, brisket and ribs are provided to each team to prepare as they wish for the tasting event and judging. Teams can also make a third dish of their choosing, cooked on their smoker, using their own food for the People's Choice award. Past People's Choice dishes have included smoked mac and cheese; chicken wings; au gratin potatoes, and desserts. The BBQ portion of the contest (smoked meats) are evaluated anonymously by judges off sight, while participants tasting the extra goodies vote for the People's Choice winner.

Last year, 102 racks of ribs and 30 briskets, totaling 450 pounds of meat, were served and over 1,500 tasting tickets were sold. The 2023 event will be held from 1:30-5:30 p.m. in Q-Lot {note: food will be served while supplies last}.


