"For the past decade, Western has been navigating the ongoing transformation of higher education and the enrollment decline due to population shifts, changes in funding, and a misguided narrative that higher

education is not worth the investment," WIU Interim President Kristi Mindrup said.

"The future of Western Illinois University is dependent upon a financially stable foundation. MACOMB - The McDonough County Health Department is recognizing August 1-7, 2024, as World Breastfeeding Week (WBW) to support and promote breastfeeding as the best source of nutrition for a baby.

Breastfeeding can have many benefits for both babies and moms. For babies, breast milk provides essential nutrition and antibodies that help babies develop a strong immune system. Breastfed babies may have a lower risk of developing asthma, obesity, type 1 and 2 diabetes, ear infections, stomach bugs, and sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS). Breastfeeding may also help improve cognitive development and survival during a baby's first year. For moms, breastfeeding may help them recover more quickly after childbirth by producing the hormone oxytocin, which helps the uterus contract and return to its normal size. Breastfeeding can also reduce the risk of high blood pressure, certain breast and ovarian cancers and type 2 diabetes. Breastfeeding can provide other benefits such as allowing moms to feed their babies on the go without having to make a bottle or prepare formula. It can also provide comfort for babies and moms alike.

To celebrate WBW, the McDonough County Health Department is hosting a milkshake social on Wednesday, Aug. 7, 2024, from 2-3pm and invites breastfeeding moms and breastfeeding supporters to join, milkshakes available to everyone as supplies last.


