

Once upon a time, these signs were the face of small-town America. These signs generated businesses that kept families afloat and dreams alive. In her seventeen-piece display, signs from old motels, gas stations, restaurants and truck stops are recaptured with breathtaking paint strokes. The majority of Dismukes' work is constructed through acrylic or mixed media art.

Most of the artist's work revolves around old-fashioned business signs, but there's one piece that stands out from the rest. It's called "Pistic Weeds" and features six separate frames showcasing decorated crosses. These crosses represent people who died on or near the roads where the crosses are placed. The piece is illustrated with black ink on white paper, which captures the solemn beauty we often overlook on our country rides. It forces us to reflect on the many who have been victims of these tragic moments.

In Dismukes' statement, she wants viewers of her contemporary collection to celebrate the things we pass by while going about our day.

"I am interested in entropy as well as the growth that is its companion," states Dismukes in her artist statement. "Close observation of the patterns and structures of patterns and structures in nature, as well as the rhythm of its seasonal cycles, is an enthusiasm and an influence... There are relationships to environment and climate, globalization, economic collapse, among other contemporary issues of both public and private concern."

So, the next time we hop into our cars and take a scenic drive through the countryside, think about the signs you see and what they truly meant then, now and forever.

Sara Dismukes' "mishearing Mnemosyne" exhibit will remain at the University Art Gallery until Friday, December 15, on the second floor. The gallery is open from 9 a.m. - noon and again 1-4 p.m., Monday-Friday. The gallery will be closed during Western Illinois University's winter break but will reopen Tuesday, January 16. Admission is free and open to the public.

WIU Alum Wins Regional Emmy Award

MACOMB, IL - - Western Illinois University 2006 Broadcasting alumnus Mike Curkov and his team won a regional award for Outstanding Achievement for News Gathering Arts/Entertainment News in the Chicago/Midwest Chapter of Emmy Awards.

Curkov, photojournalists Cody Bergquist and Kevin Weis and producers Randy Engel and Susanne Barthel worked on the winning story titled "Why we're using subtitles more often while watching and streaming TV shows and movies."

Curkov interviews two professional audio engineers at Independent Studios in Milwaukee, Randy Bobo and Peter Batchelder, to find out why we need subtitles when streaming or watching TV shows and can hear classic shows more easily. Bobo and Batchelder say it has much to do with both filmmakers and streaming technologies.

In his acceptance speech on a Facebook post, Curkov stated that teamwork and collaboration were the missing ingredients needed to achieve his goal.

"I've tried for years to win. I was always devastated after the list came out. I didn't get what I was missing," Curkov said. "Once I went from my work to our work, really good stuff started happening."

Curkov is a morning news anchor at WDJT CBS 58 News, where he has covered the Bucks championship parade and the Super Bowl. He has won seven Wisconsin Broadcasters Association awards and has been nominated for two regional Emmys.

Before joining CBS 58 News, Curkov worked with Nexstar Broadcasting Group as the sports director for a year and the morning news anchor from 2014-2016. In addition, Curkov has worked as a producer, media relations director, marketing director, sports director and group sales staff member in various media outlets.

Curkov is an active volunteer at various local non-profits, dedicating his time to making a positive impact in the community. He extends his passion for community involvement by serving as a youth football coach and holding the role of t-ball vice president at Grafton Little League. His commitment to philanthropy extends to organizations such as the Midwest Athletes Against



Childhood Cancer (MACC) Fund, Wisconsin Humane Society and Operations Finally Home, among others.

Beyond his philanthropic endeavors, Curkov wears another hat as a professional wrestler with Great Lakes Championship Wrestling, SSW Entertainment and One Fall Entertainment. Under the stage name "Iron Mike," he achieved success by winning the Great Lakes Championship Wrestling (GLCW) tag team competition in 2022 alongside World Wrestling Entertainment (WWE) legend AI Snow. His multifaceted involvement reflects a dedication to both community service and the world of professional wrestling.
