The Buzz about West Nile Virus

West Nile Virus (WNV) is the leading cause of mosquito-borne disease in the US. Cases of WNV occur during mosquito season. There is no vaccine to prevent WNV or medications to treat WNV in people. While most infected individuals experience no symptoms, approximately 1 in 150 infected people develop a serious and sometimes fatal illness.

From May until October, MCHD participates in West Nile Virus surveillance. This includes the collection of dead birds for testing, trapping mosquitoes and testing batches of mosquitoes.

MCHD is a leader in this area in WNV surveillance, mosquito trapping and testing. The Environmental Health division traps and collects mosquitoes from various locations throughout McDonough County on a weekly basis. The mosquitoes are then frozen to preserve viral RNA until they are tested.

MCHD uses the RAMP (rapid analyte measurement platform) system to conduct it's own testing. Collected mosquitoes are ground up and then added to a buffer solution. The buffer solution is transferred to a RAMP testing cartridge, after the specified wait time, the cartridge is inserted into the RAMP reader and within a few minutes, results are provided.

MCHD is one of the few local health departments to conduct their own mosquito testing programs and is the result of the continued efforts of MCHD, first in partnership with Western Illinois University and then in efforts to secure testing equipment and funding for supplies and traps. MCHD also partners with the Hancock and Schuyler County Health Departments to conduct testing of their collected mosquitoes.

emotional friend, a compassionate nurse, and a witty companion. She instituted formal nursing education in 1860 with the founding of the Nightingale Training School for Nurses.

Both Behymer and Schabatka graduated May 11 with their Associate Degree in Nursing, and are now eligible to take the NCLEX-RN exam.

I met a good farmer today: How land ethic shapes our future

I met a good farmer today. In recollection, I don't think I've ever met a bad farmer, but this encounter was different. Immediately we hit it off. The conversation turned from the windbreak I came to look at to our former dogs. We talked about marriage and kids. It seemed like I had known this guy my whole life. The conversation came easy.

He had just taken a break from spraying to meet up with me to take a look at what seemed to be spider mite damage to his spruce windbreak. He had first noticed the damage last fall. The dry weather has promoted spruce spider mite populations and the current drought this spring of 2023 continues from last fall when our evergreens went into winter in a water deficit.


From the windbreak, we went to take a look at some ailing maples next to a large pond. The farmer told me the story of how his father dug out this pond and he swam in it as a kid. Today his grandkids swim and fish in this same pond.

I asked about chemical runoff and if that was ever a concern. He described his stormwater management strategy and how much care he takes in managing the waterways of the property. Water and soil conservation are paramount to the future of agriculture, and this farmer knew it. He lamented on the poor farming practices mainly the corporate-owned ag companies that look to production on an annual basis and not through to the next generation. One example given was the traffic of equipment in waterways and sometimes the complete removal of vegetation that once kept sediment on the field now silt in surface water downstream and causes algae blooms from nutrient runoff.

Speaking with this farmer I heard the pride in his voice as he talked of his clean water and healthy soils. I could see a strong land ethic both within him and around him on the land that he stewards. Aldo Leopold describes a land ethic as a reflection of an ecological conscience, "and this in turn reflects a conviction of individual responsibility for the health of the land. Health is the capacity of the land for self-renewal. Conservation is our effort to understand and preserve this capacity."

This farmer intends to hand over this land to a future generation and has worked hard to preserve the health of the land. We have lost many things in this world that can only be read about in history books and told in stories. This farmer is making sure deep soil, diverse wildlife, and a cool dip in a pond on a hot summer day aren't things of the past, but of the future. I met a good farmer today and it made me hopeful that things can be made better.

What can I expect over the course of the game?

- Players of all ages and backgrounds, from all over the country, will camp in the woods, compete as tribes in a variety of physical, mental and skill based challenges throughout the day, with the challenge losers voting each other out. The game will follow
- a similar format to the popular reality TV series Survivor.

 As spectators, you will be able to watch many of the challenges live, and attend most tribal councils to watch as players get voted out.
- There is a short walk from the challenge field to the tribal council area (where players are voted out), so expect to walk back and forth throughout the day. While the walk is short, we recommend you wear comfortable shoes as you will walk back and forth many times each day, and may walk back and forth to your car multiple times.
- You must stay in the spectator areas; you will not have access to the camps or any behind the scenes player interviews as they live in the woods over the course of the 5 days.
- There may be some breaks throughout each day where the
