January Proclaimed National Stalking Awareness Month

Thank you to McDonough County Sherriff Nicholas Petitgout for signing a proclamation with WIRC-CAA Victim Services declaring January as National Stalking Awareness Month. Proclamation;

WHEREAS: January is known around the United States as National Stalking Awareness Month to ensure that the victims know they are not alone; and

WHEREAS: 1 in 3 women and 1 in 6 men in the United States have experienced some form of stalking violence in their lifetime, and 58% of women and 49% of male were first stalked before they were 25

WHEREAS: Stalking violence not only includes following, but can include unwanted contact, emotional trauma and harassment, misuse of technology, unwanted gifts, threatening words or actions, intimidation and fear, and controlling, tracking, and scaring; and

WHEREAS: Stalking violence is a pattern of behavior directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to feel fear for the person's safety or the safety of others, or to suffer substantial emotional distress; and

WHEREAS: There are resources available in Henderson County for victims of stalking



violence and their families, and we commend the work of public and private entities that strive to provide resources and support stalking violence survivors; and

WHEREAS: We recognize that racism, homophobia, transphobia, ageism, and discrimination based on ability, nationality or other factors help to perpetuate stalking violence and make finding safety even more difficult


